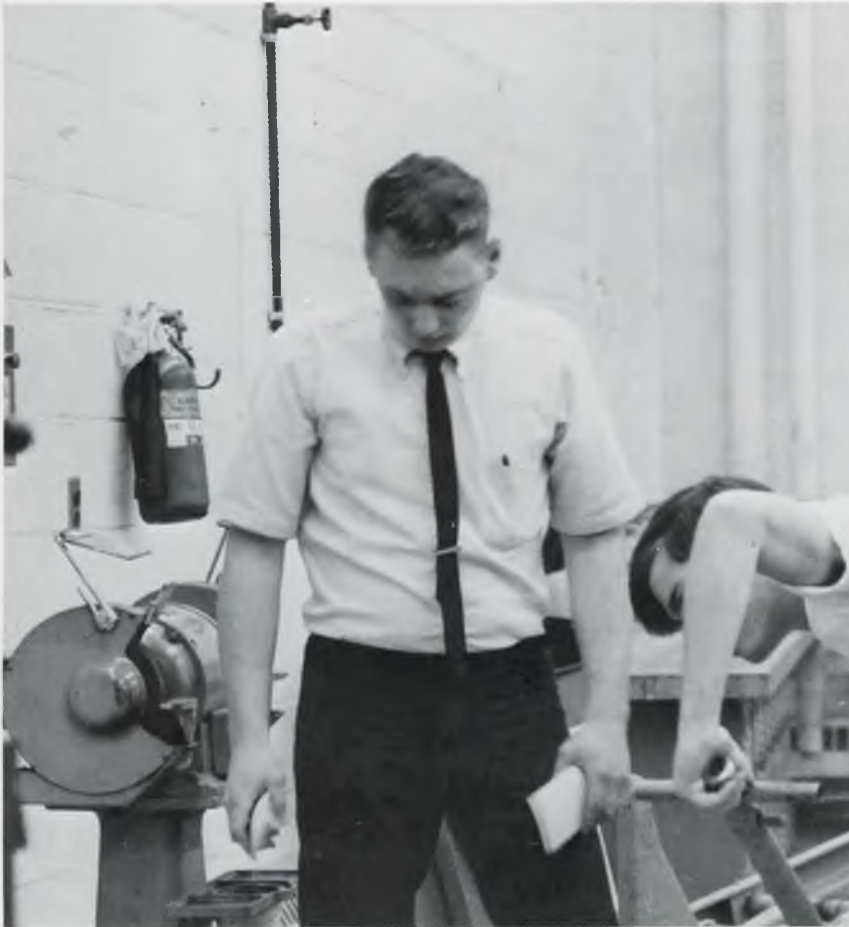
Industrial Arts Prepare Students for Vocational Careers

Several members of the journalism class attended a workshop at U of D this fall. Many new ideas and techniques that they learned were used in the paper and magazine this year.

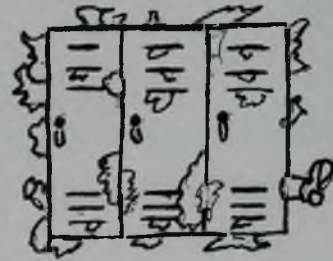
In the midst of each student's orderly world, there exists: A locker! Yes, friends, we all are aware of our lockers, those bulging bastions of what can be classified as "instant slum."

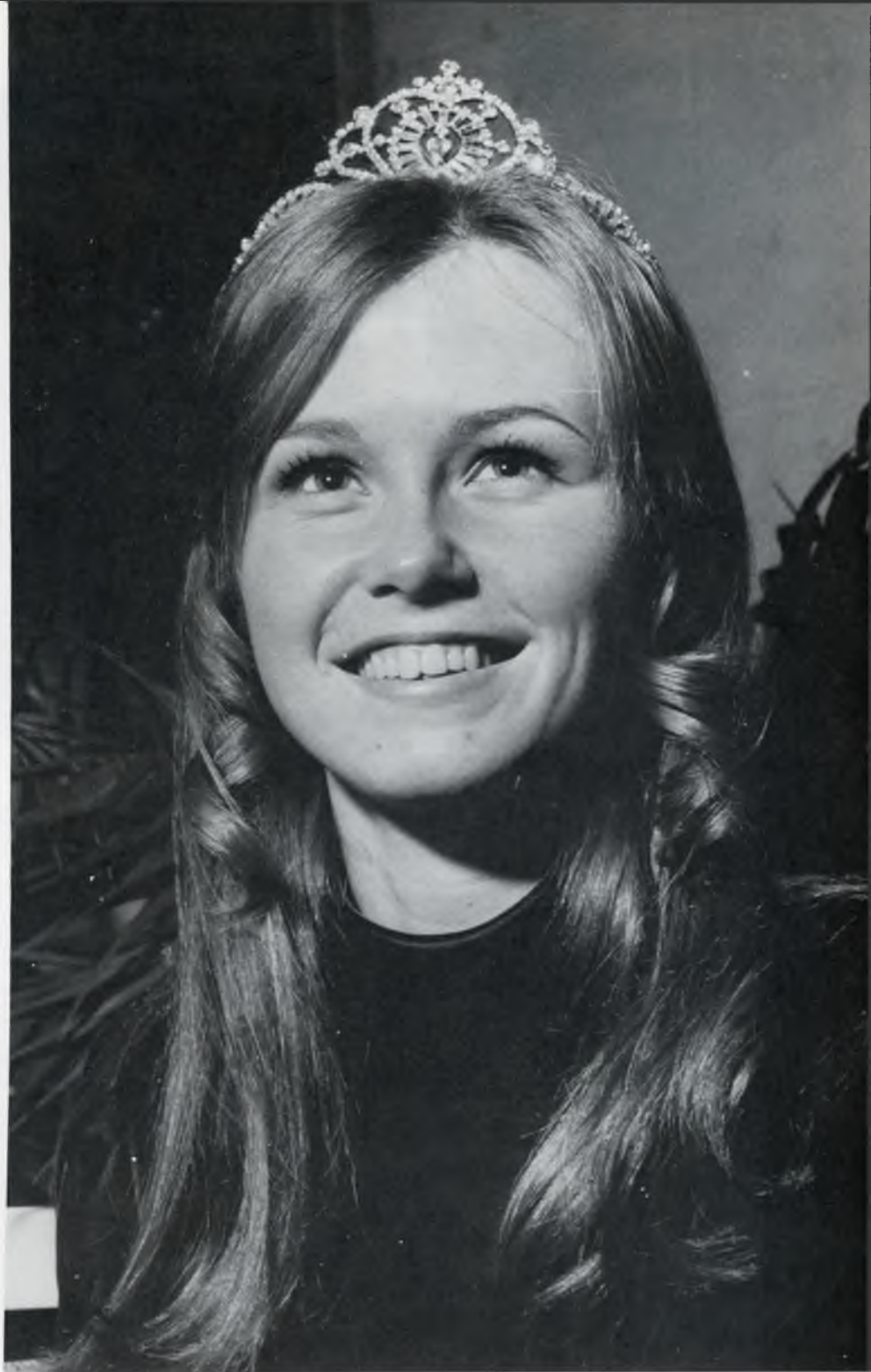

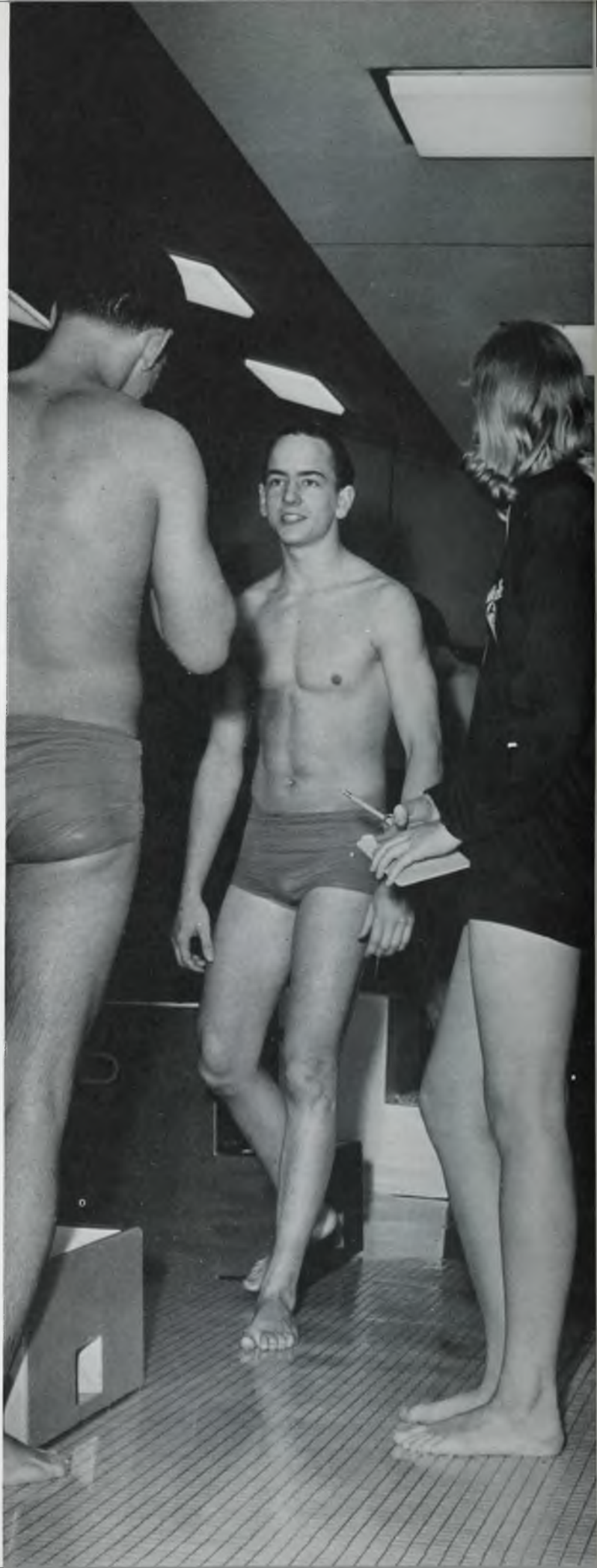


They Swam the Channels to Supremacy
