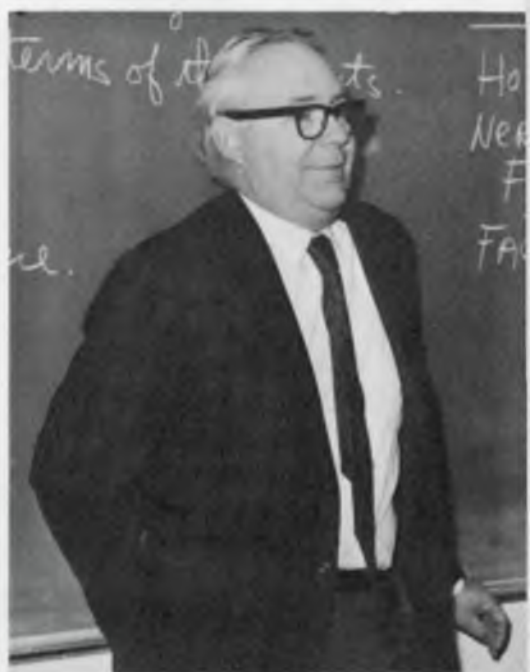

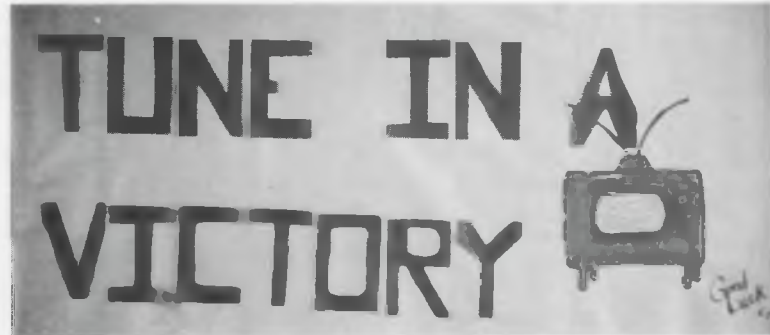

Largely responsible for this late season surge of

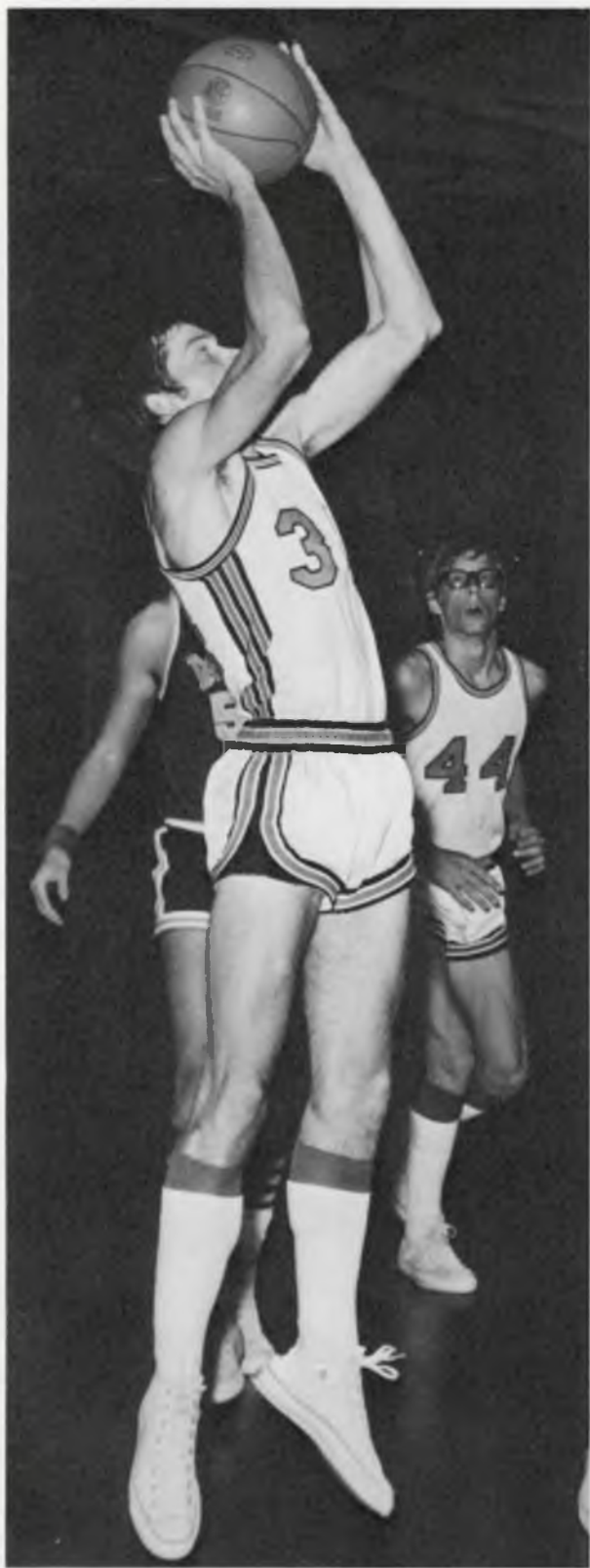

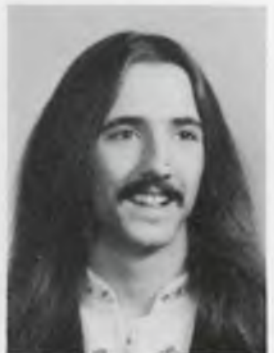
