Positive thinking helps

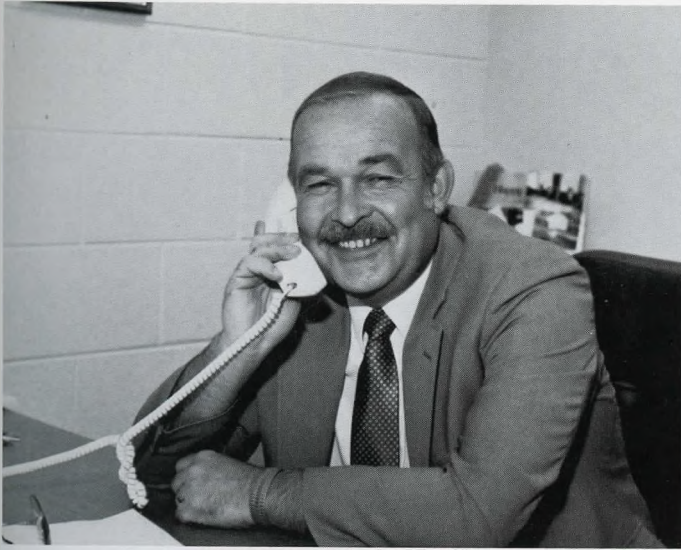

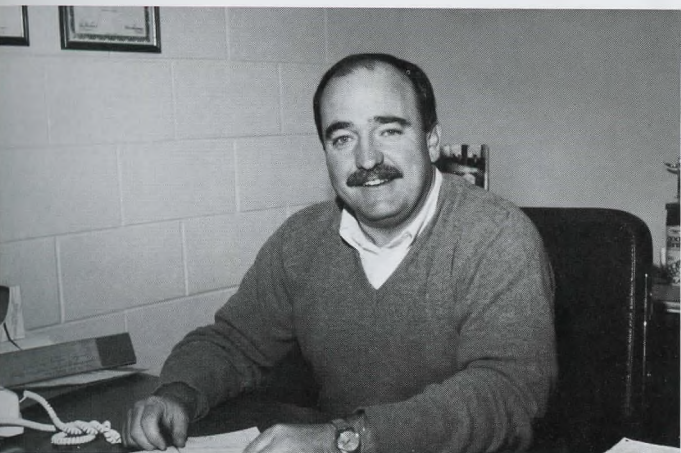

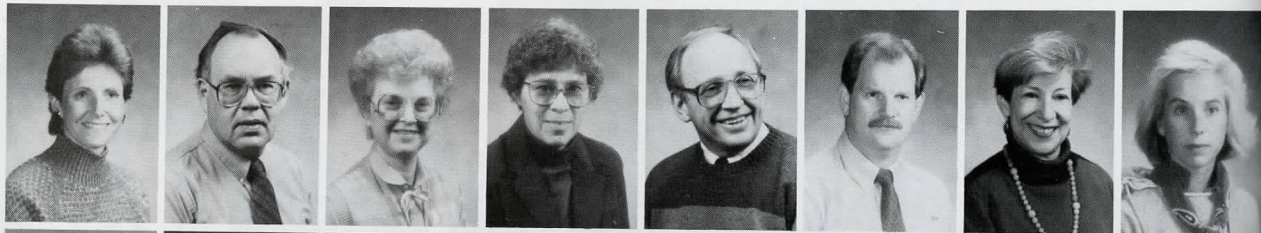

Administrative Staff Upholds NHS

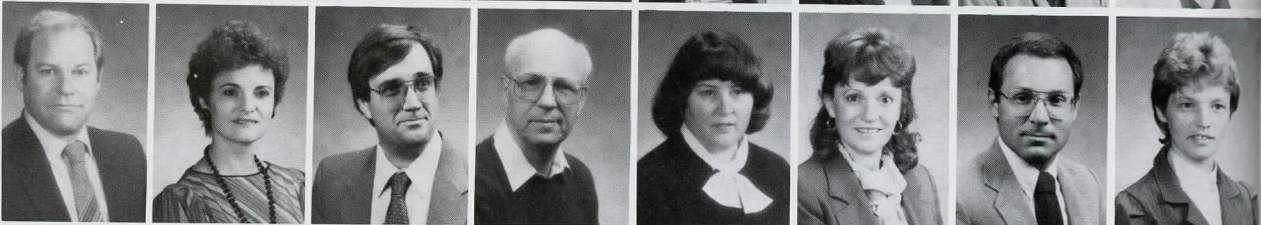
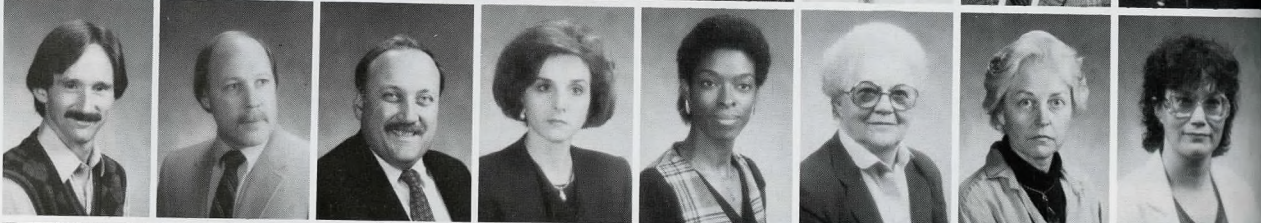
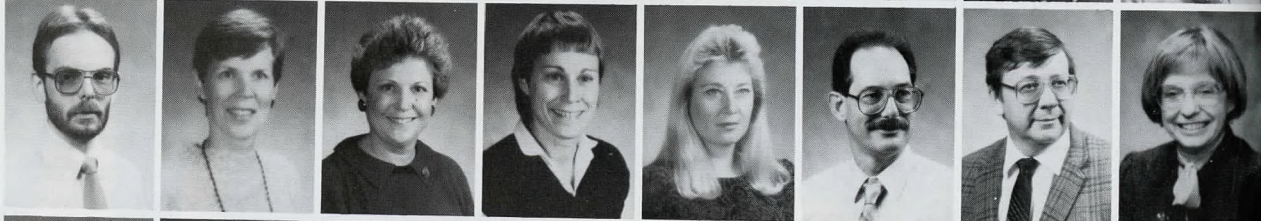

Counselors Provide Helpful Assistance

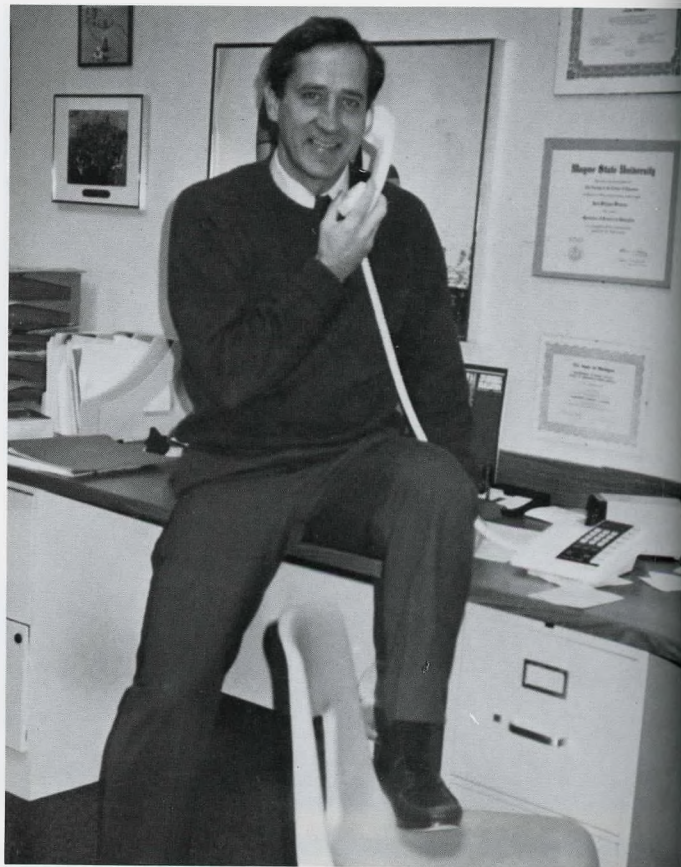

Support Programs Flourish

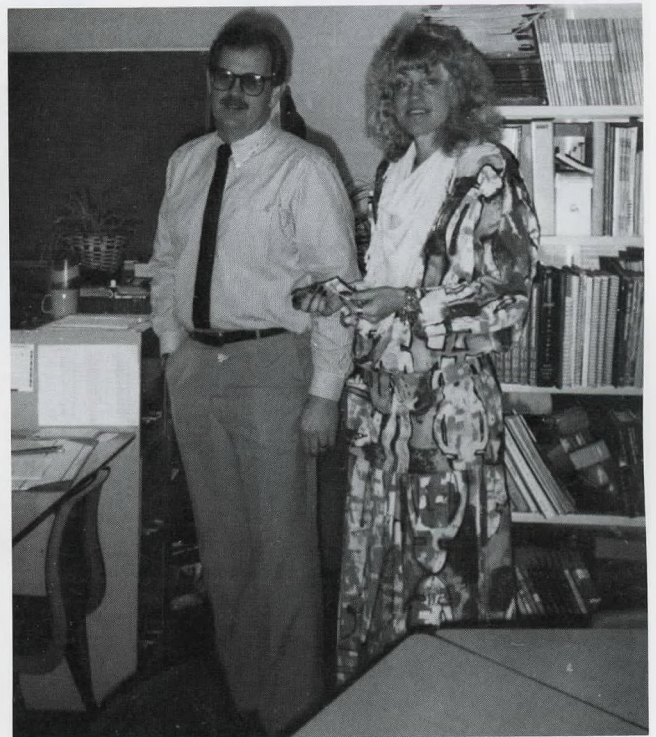

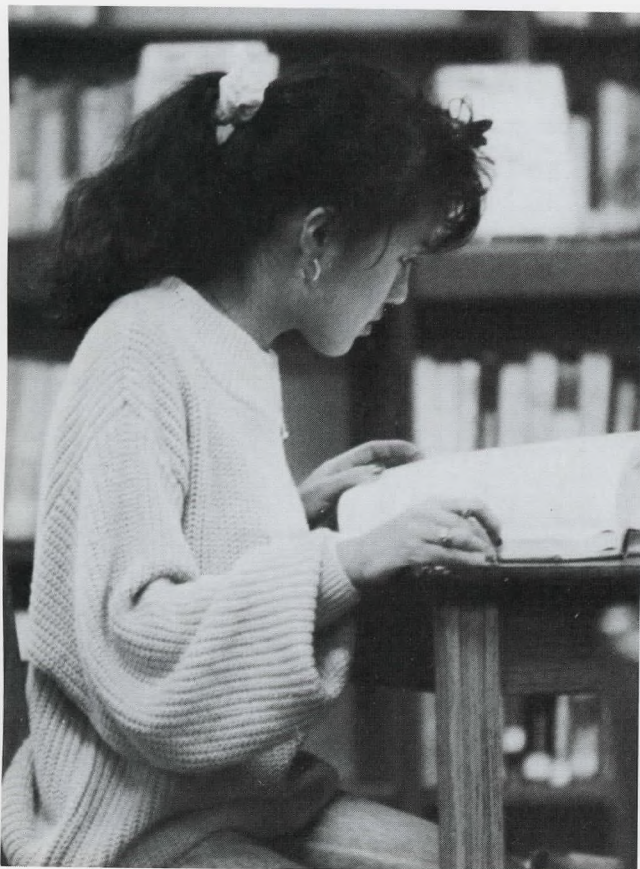

Library Gets Top Grades

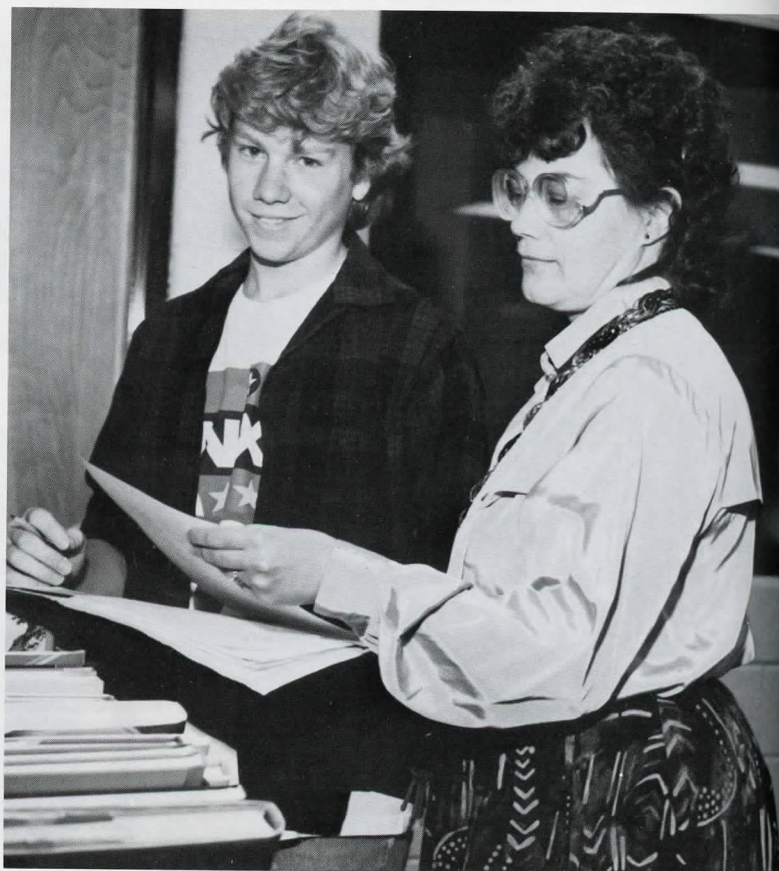

Northville High School offers a unique program for helping students and parents deal with substance abuse problems. Presently the program involves setting up Chemical Awareness Groups featuring speakers, tapes and movies which aid students in evaluating their own chemical use, an Aftercore Group for students who are recovering from chemical dependency addiction, and reinforcement through counseling and peer support.

Through presentations to community groups as well as staff and classrooms there exists an open forum for discussion and community awareness to the ever present problems of substance abuse.

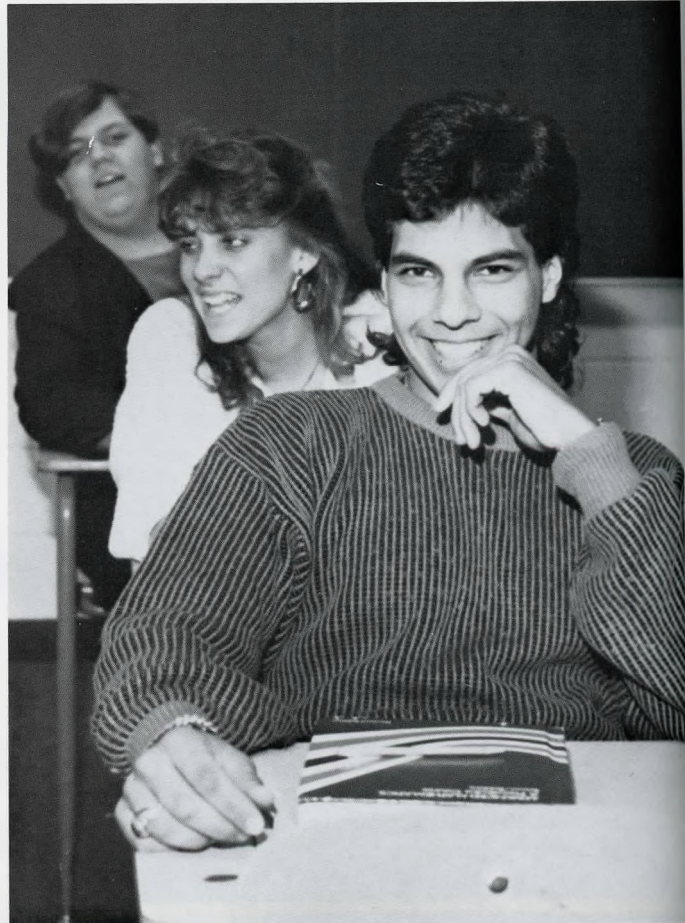

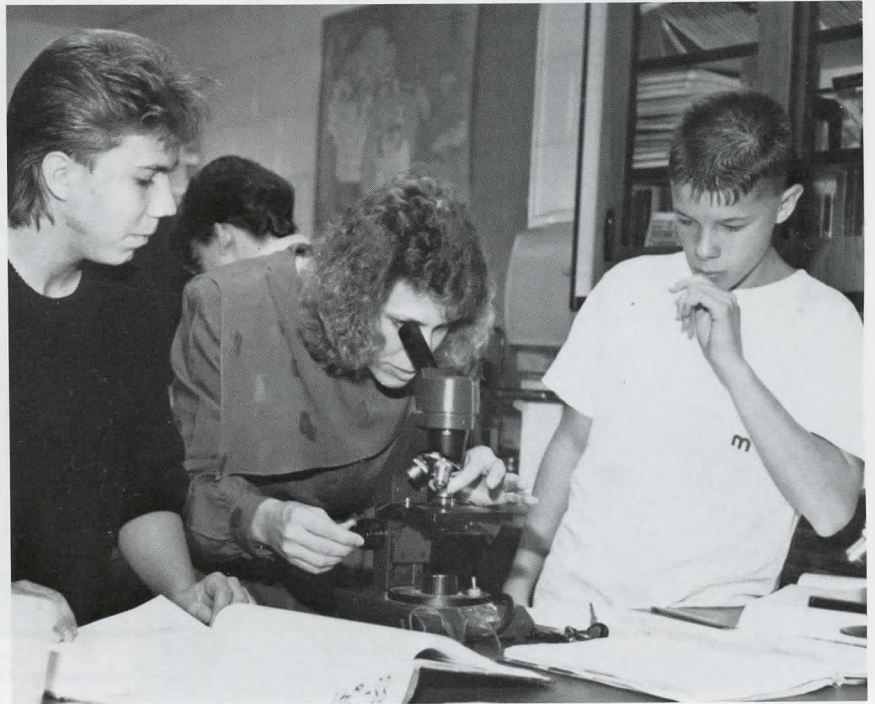

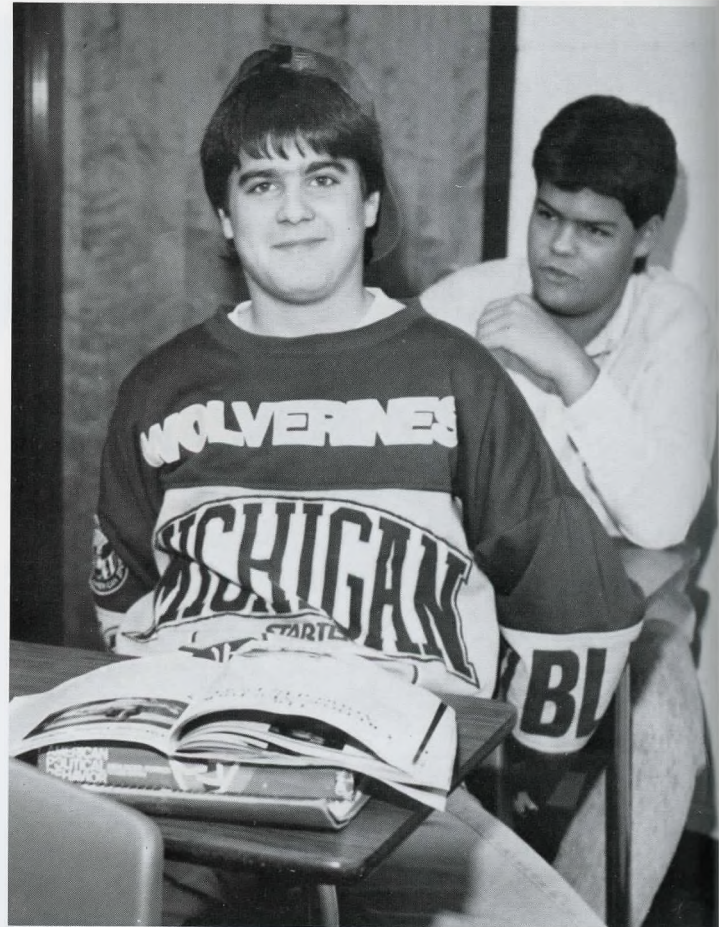

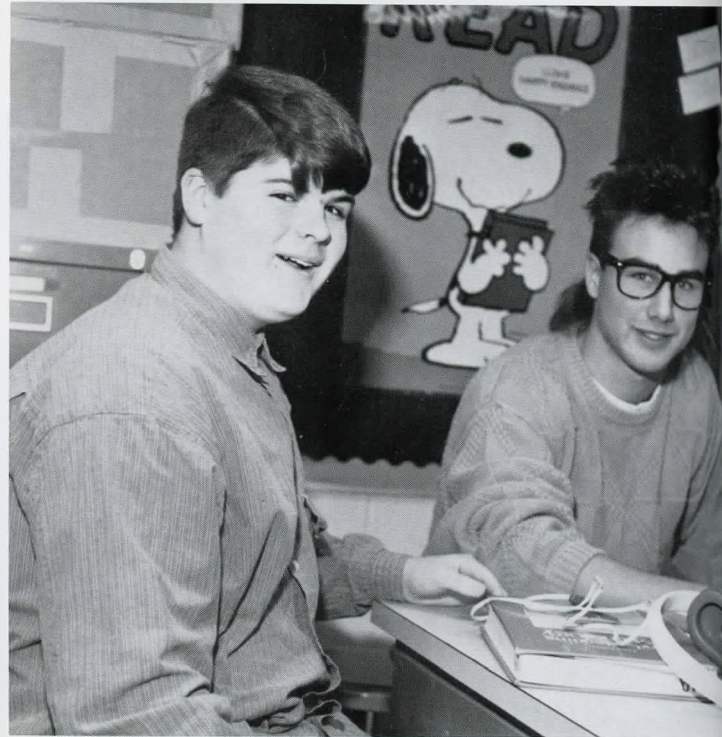

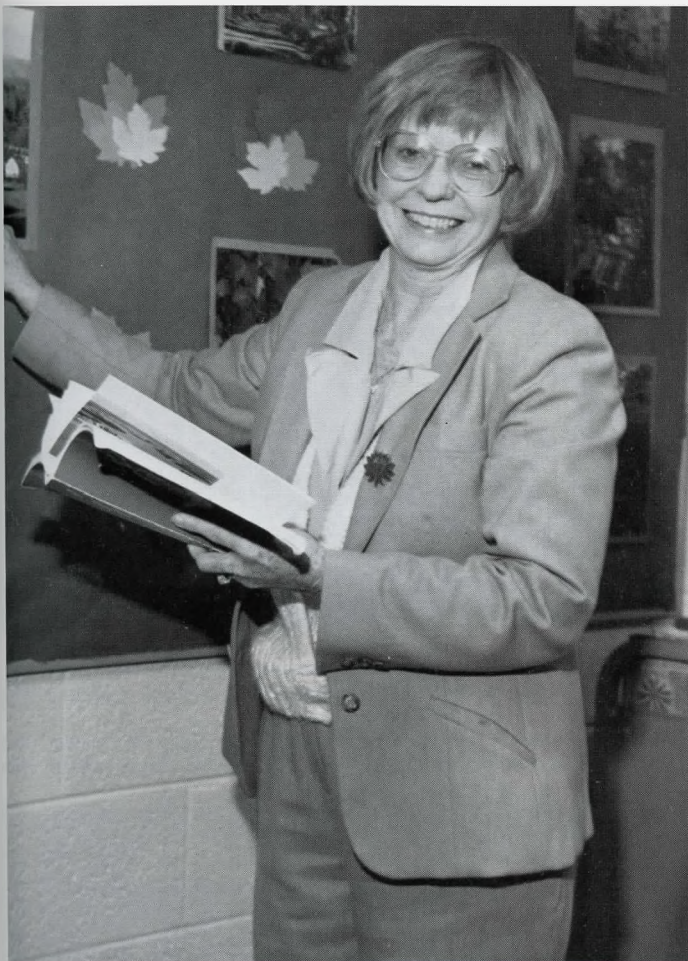

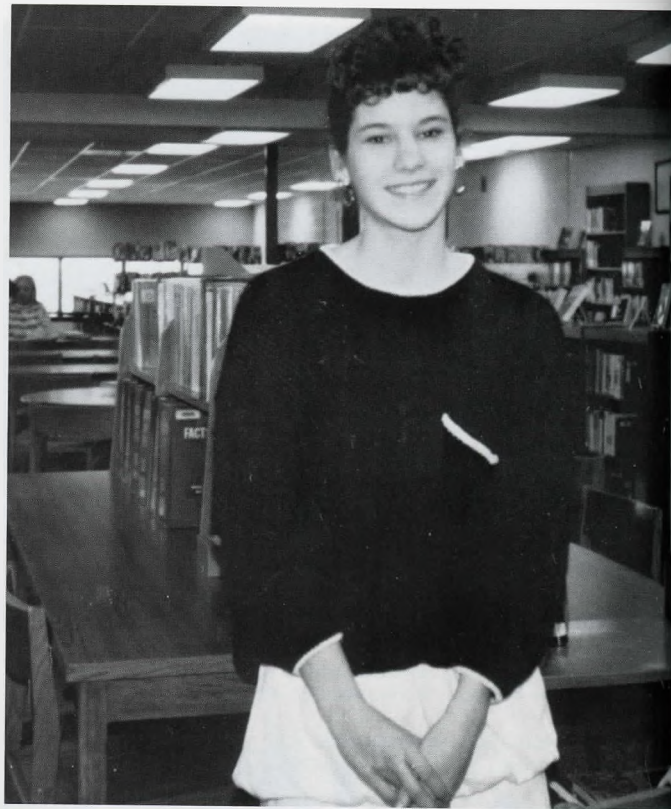


Outstanding Abilities Rewarded

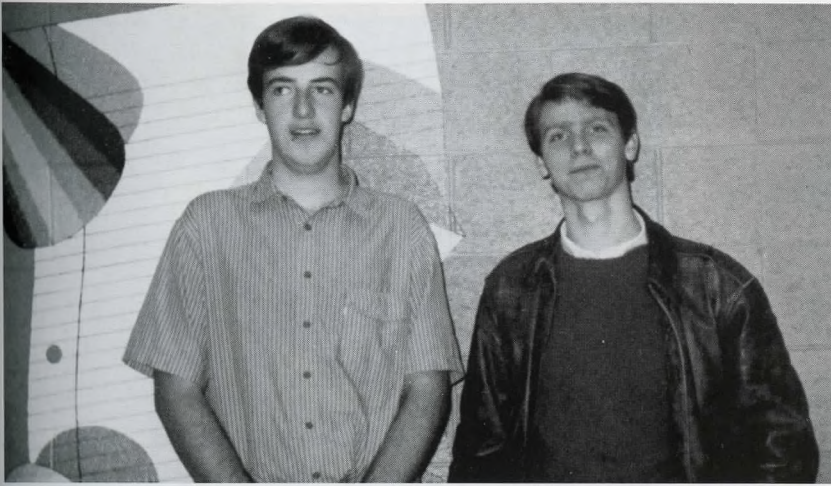

Everyday practicality

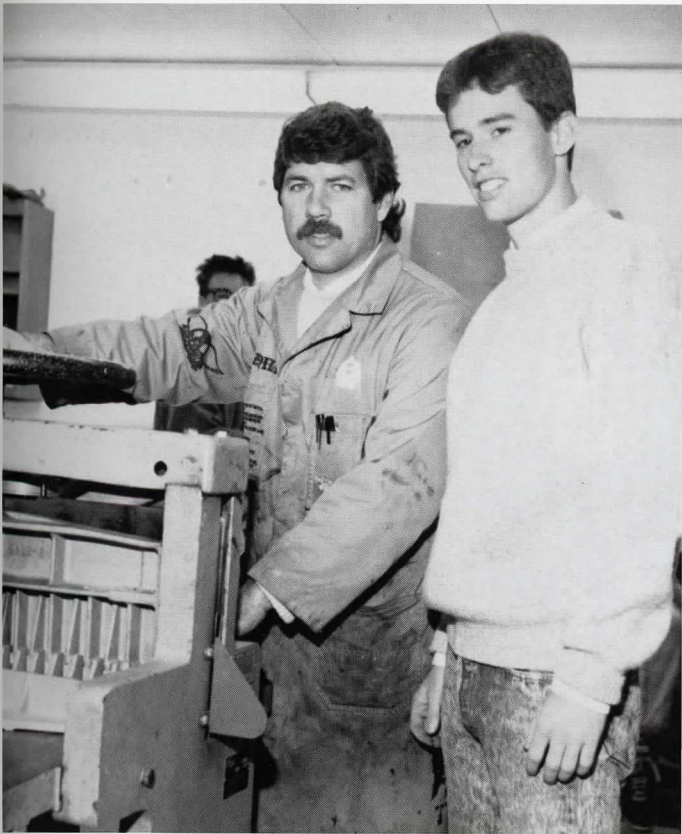

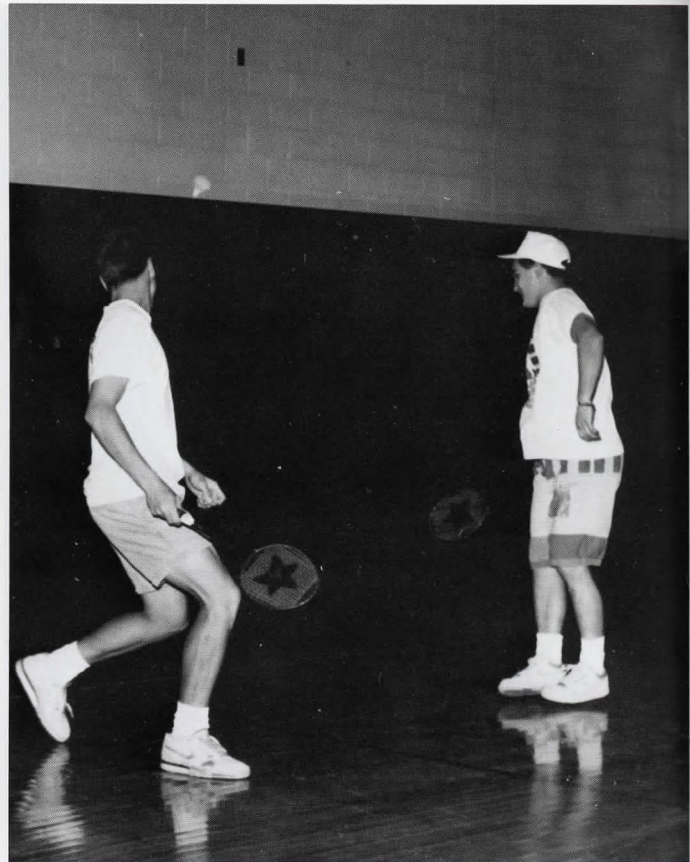

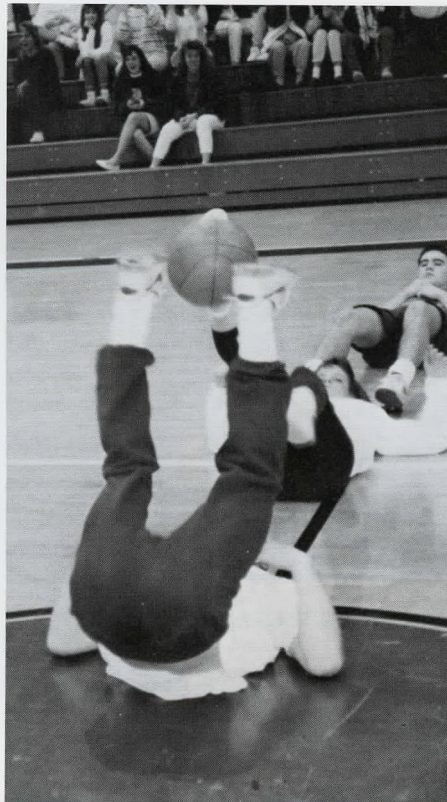

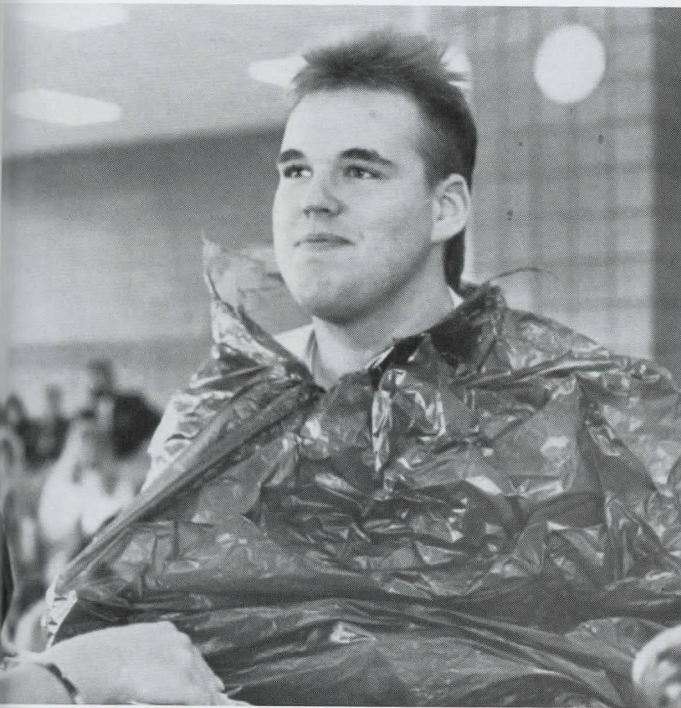

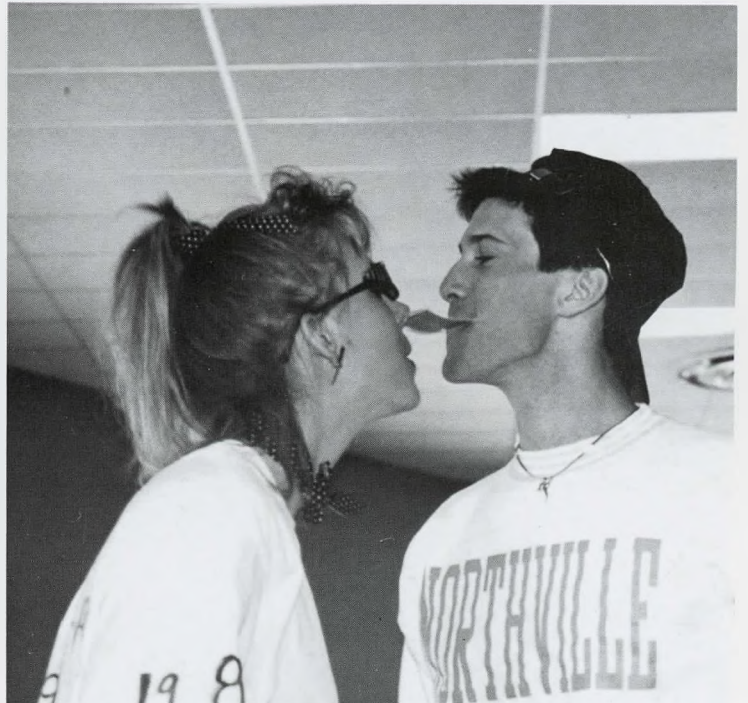

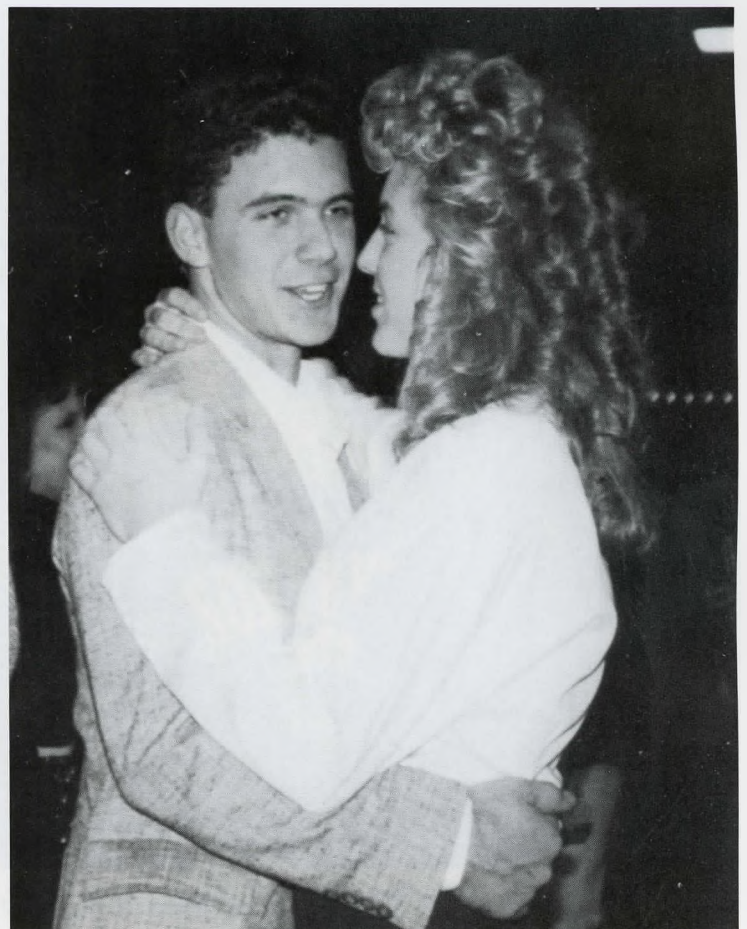

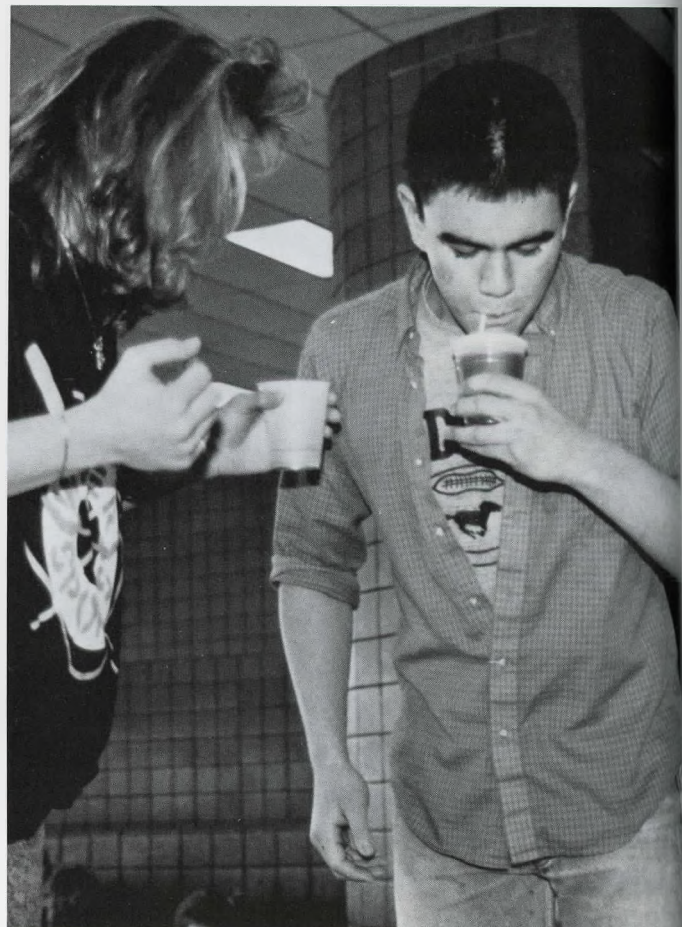

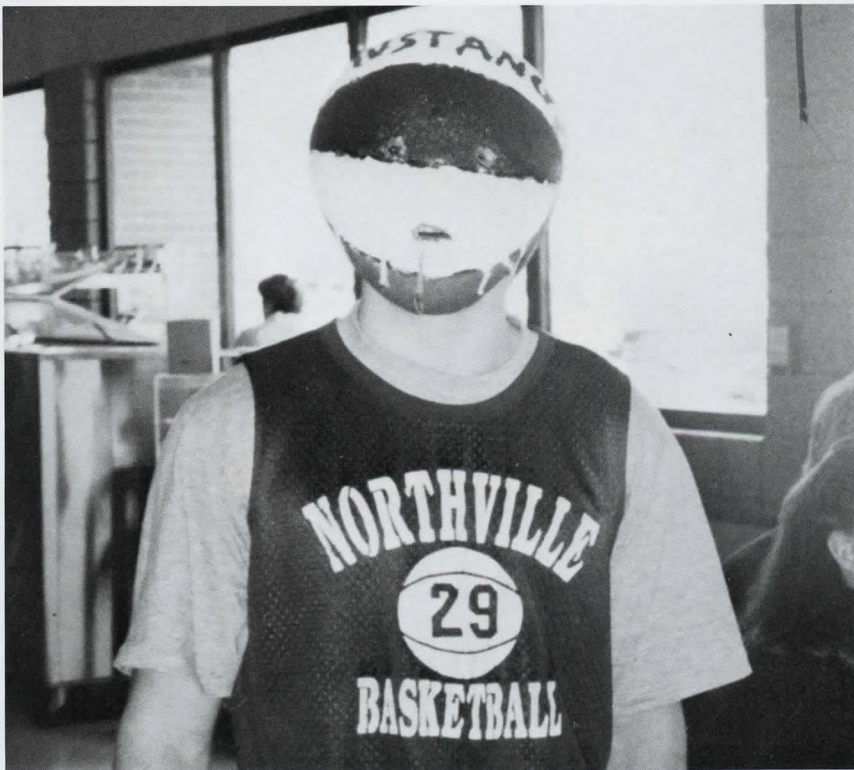

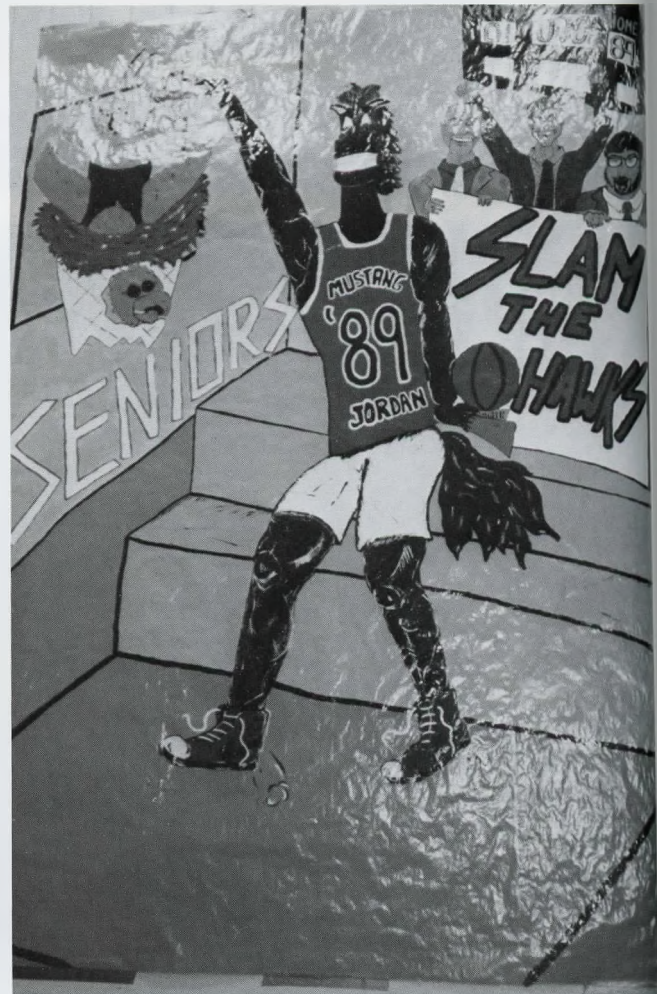

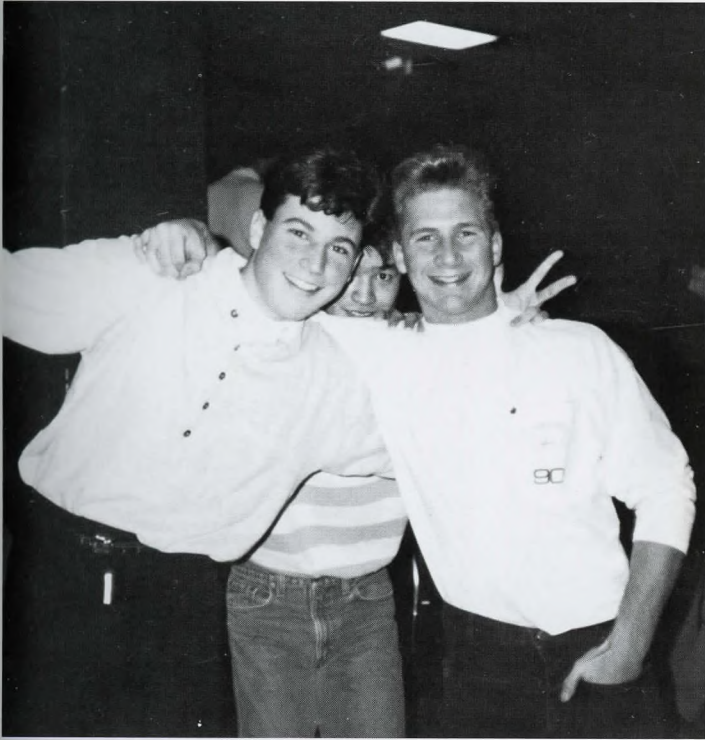

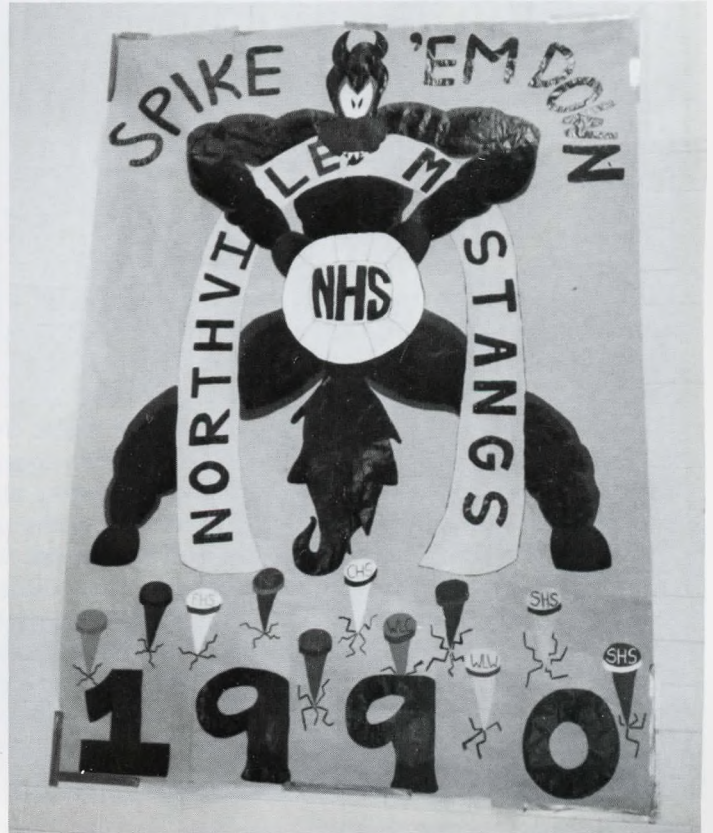

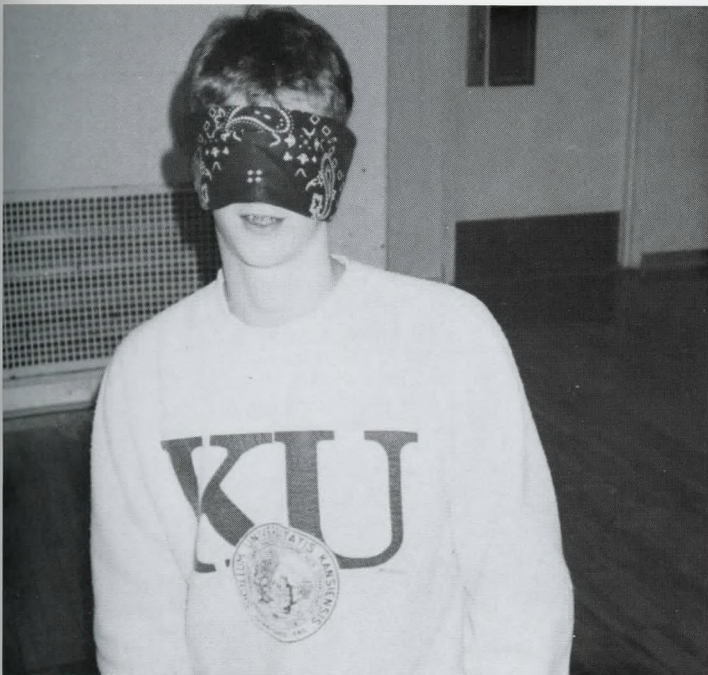

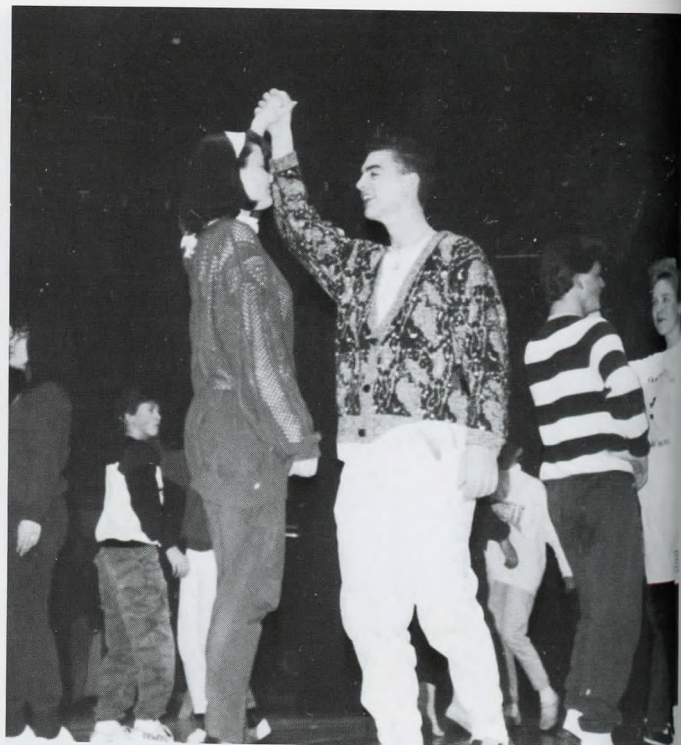

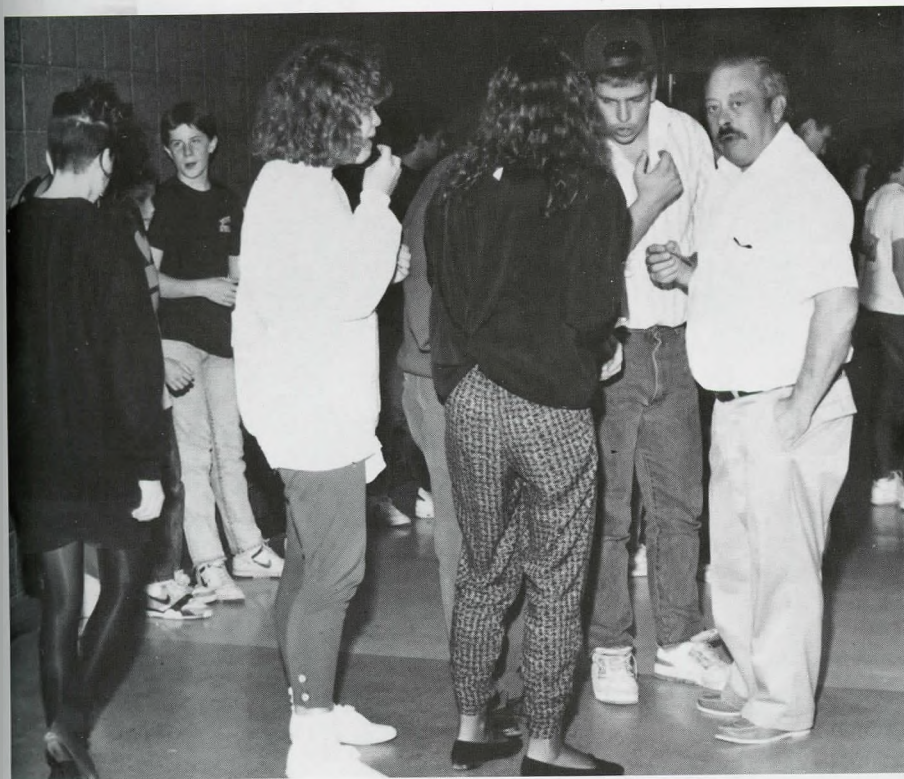

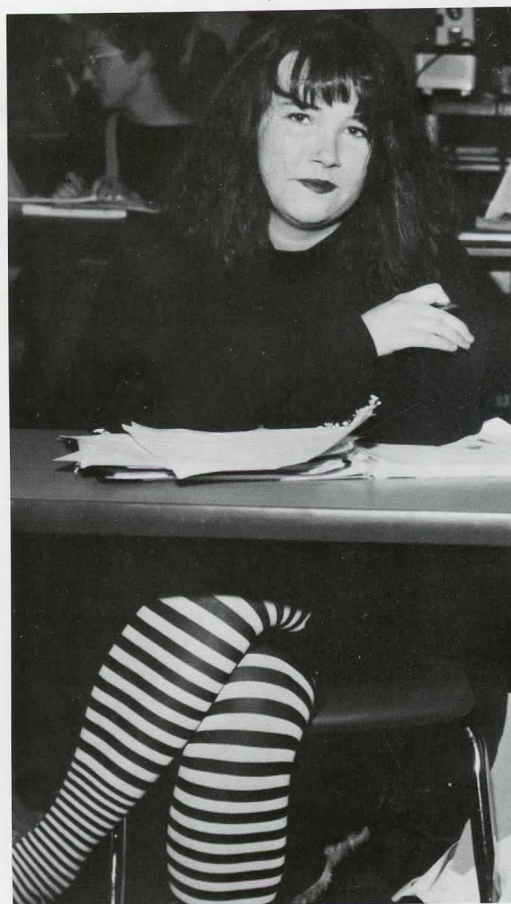

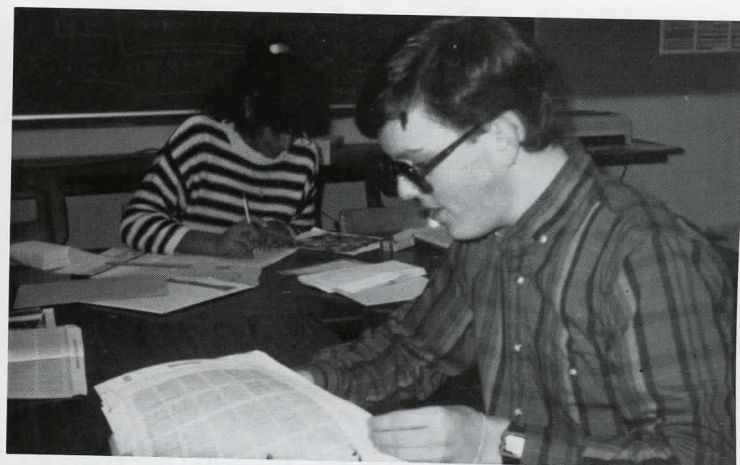

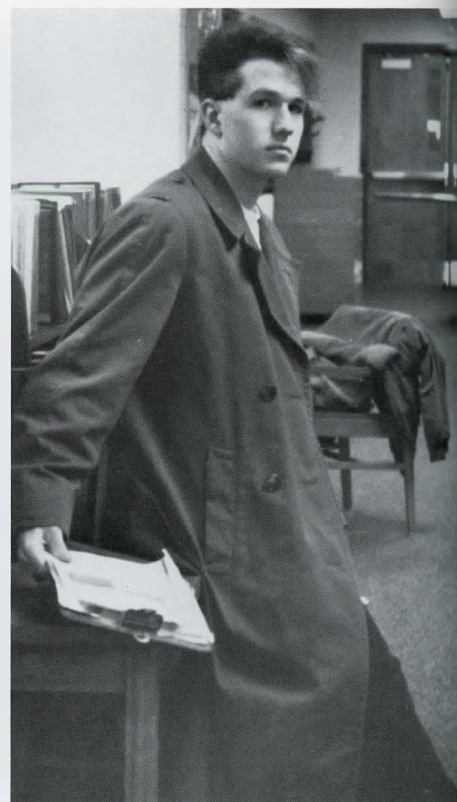

Another Great Debate Year

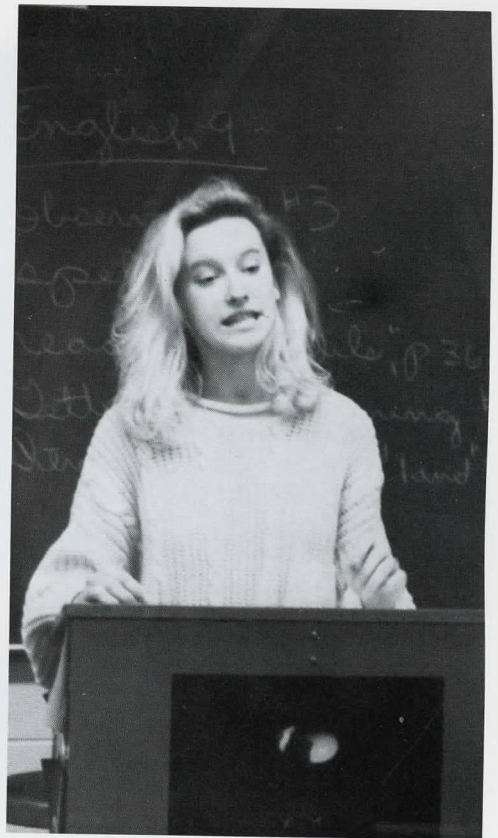

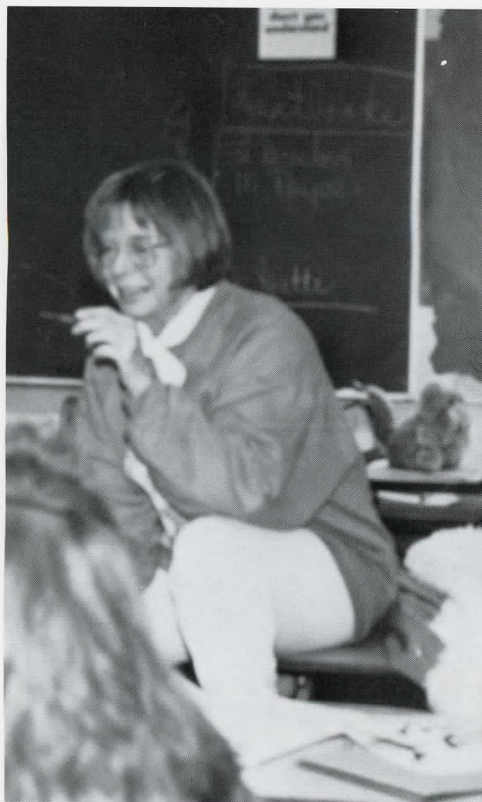

Science For Competition

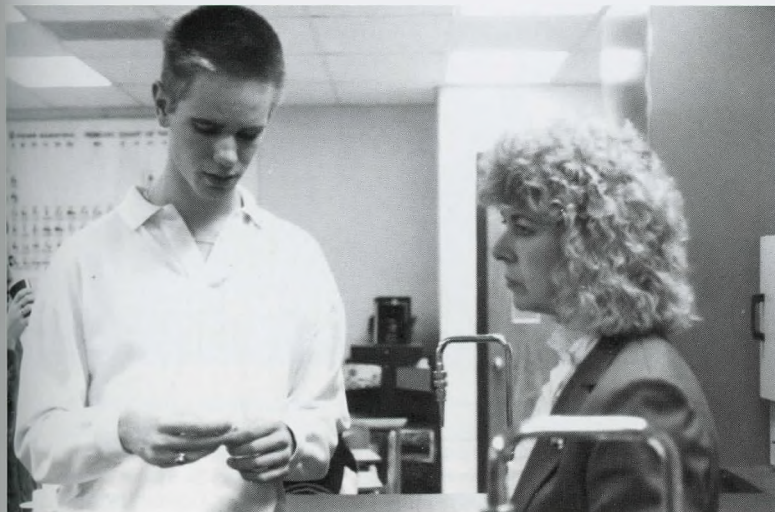

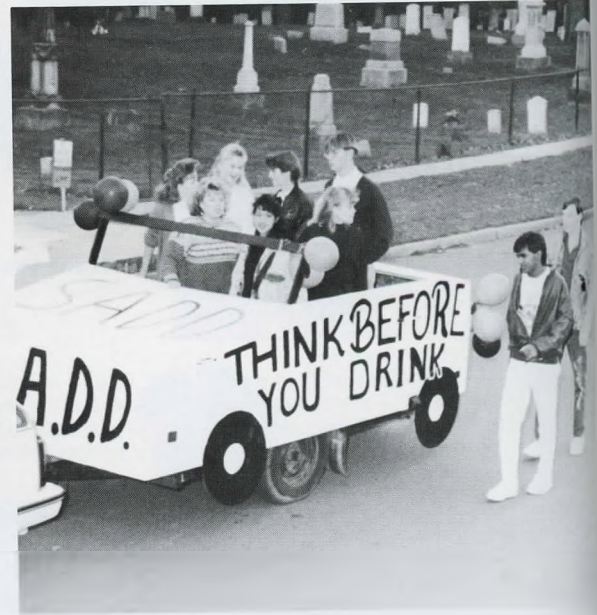

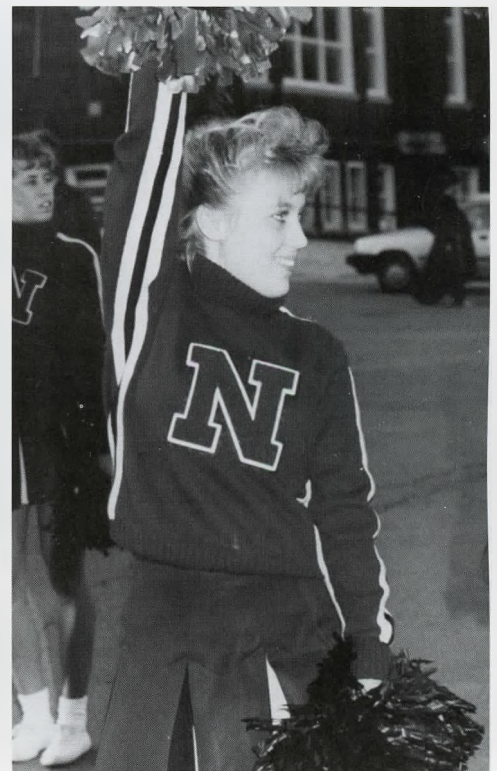

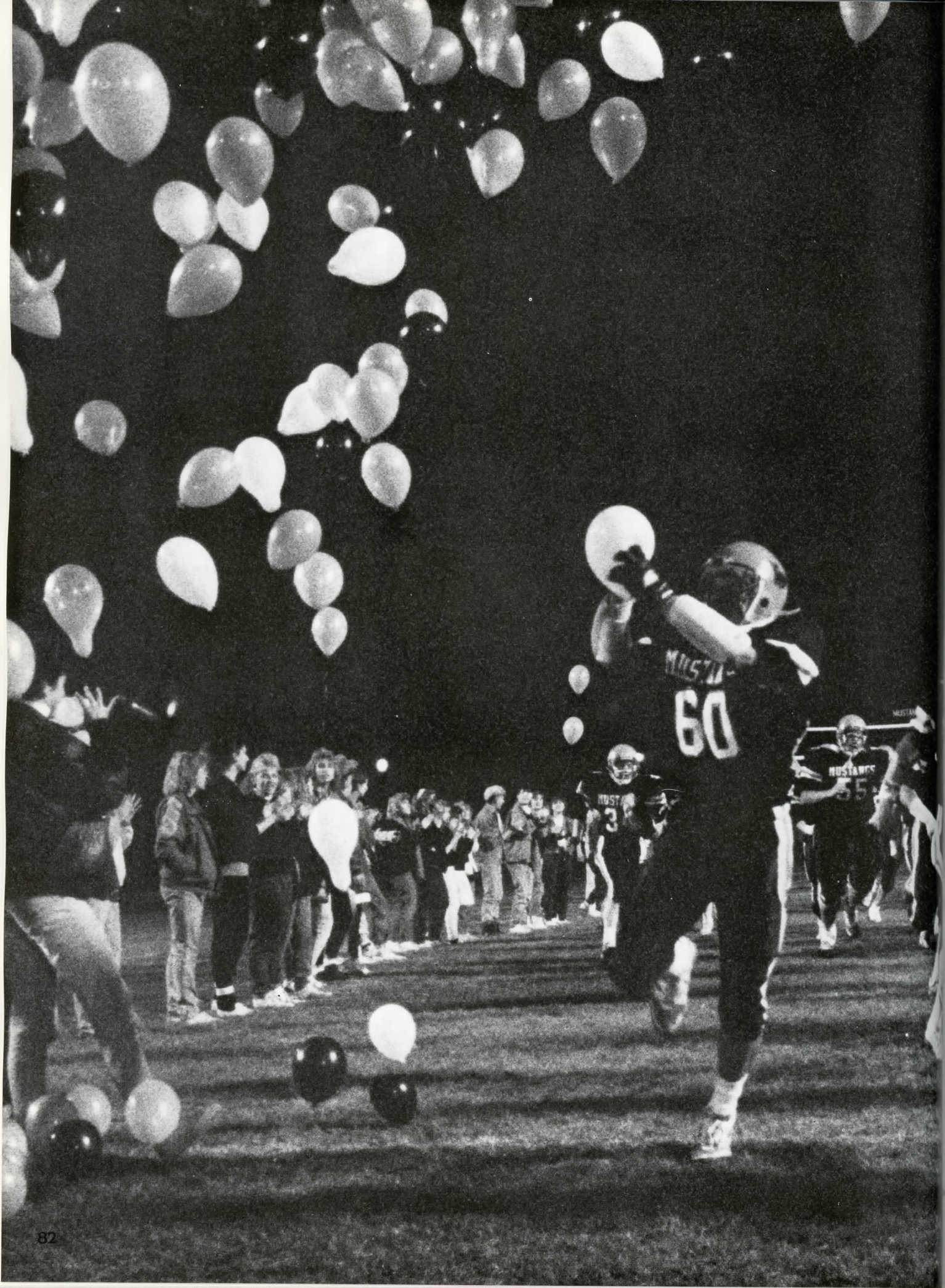

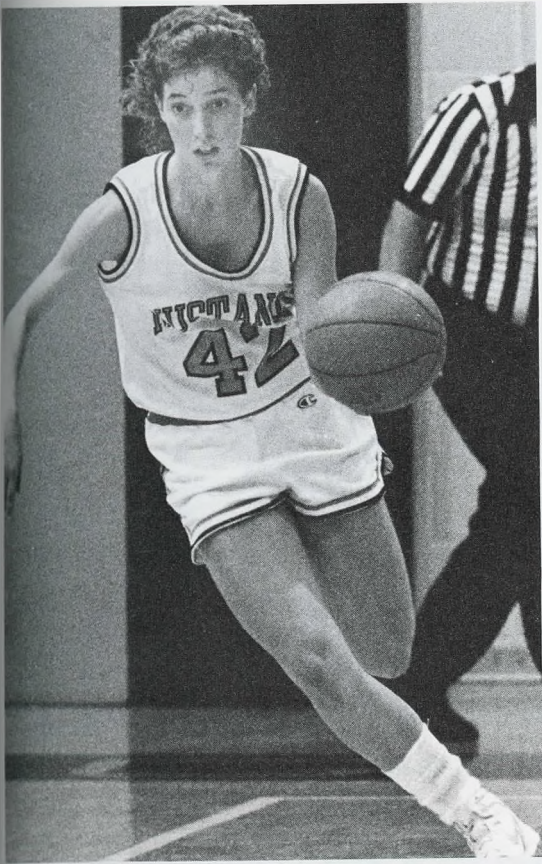

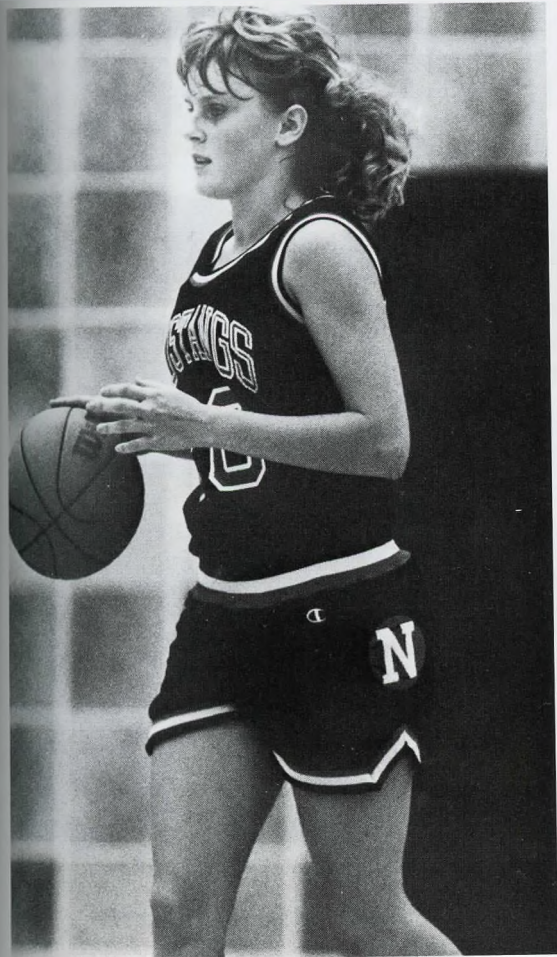

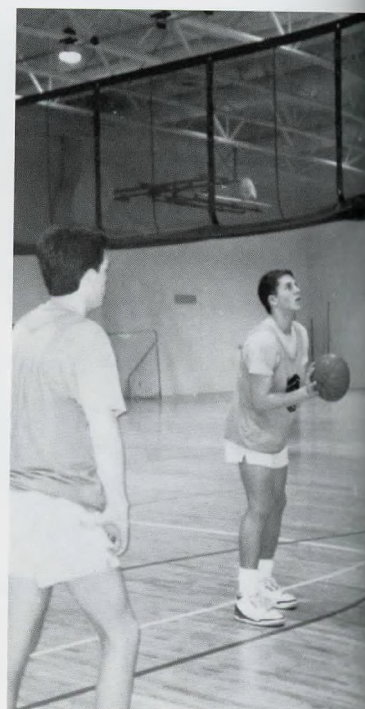

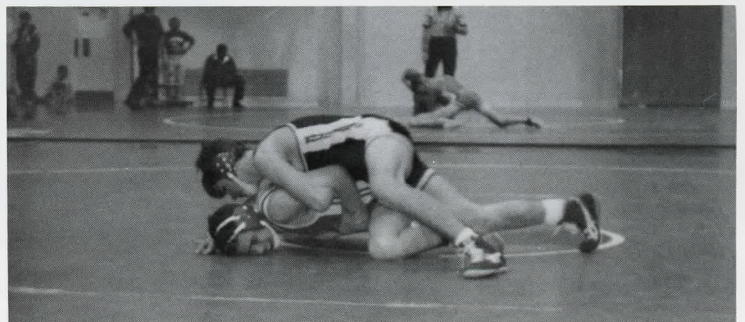

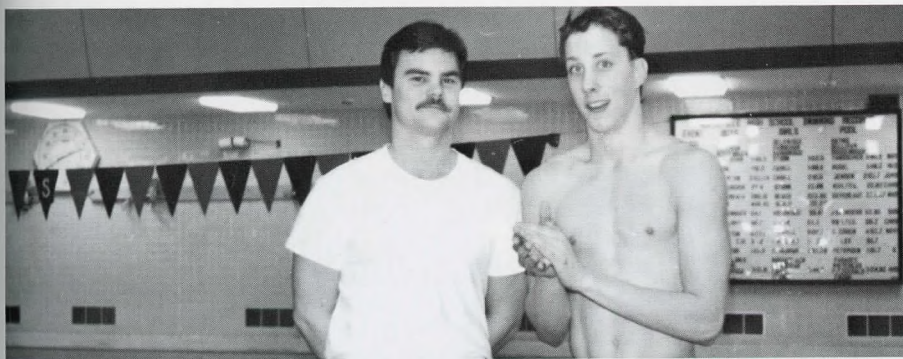

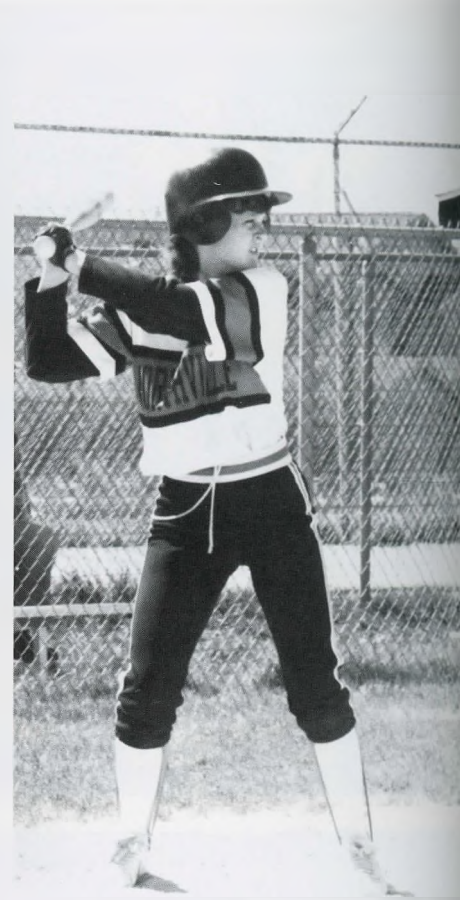

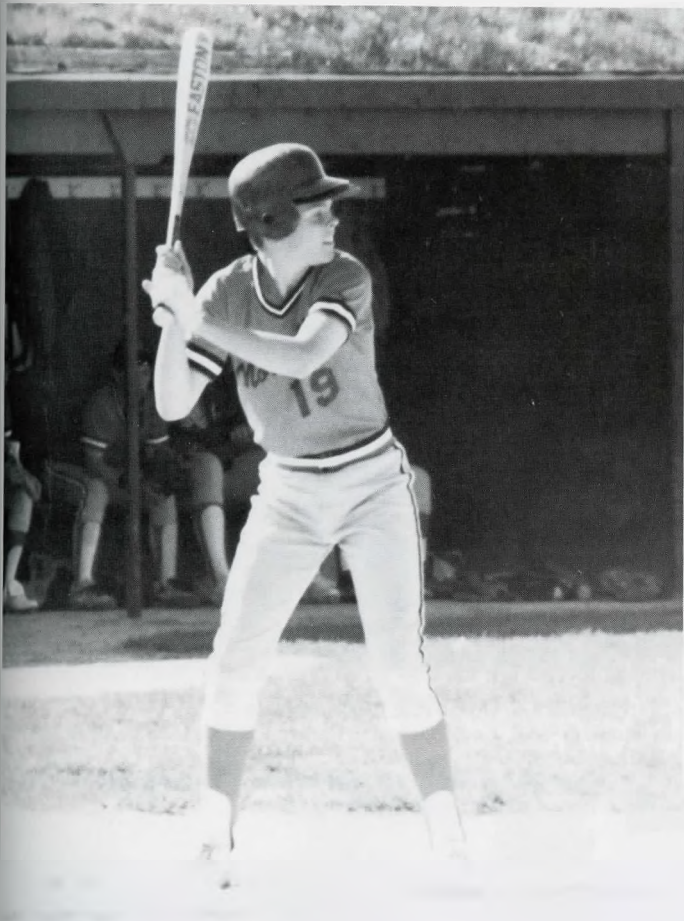

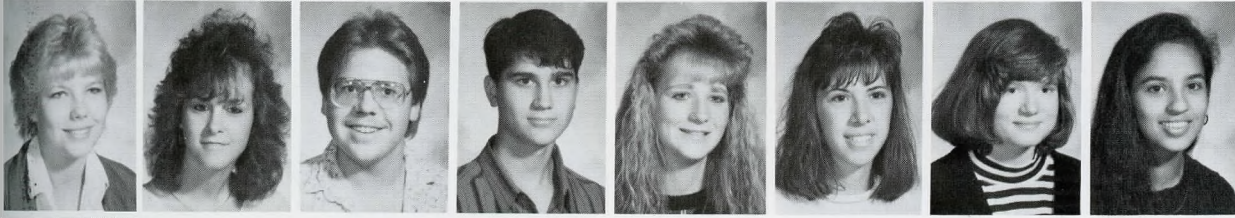


JUNIORS
