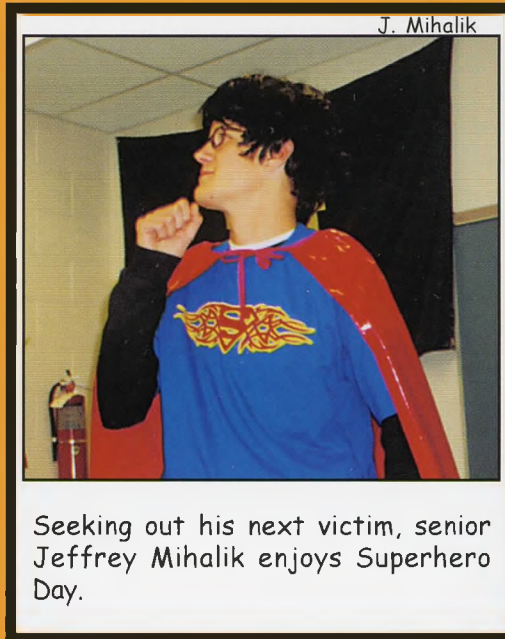

school spirit by layering on the orange and black.

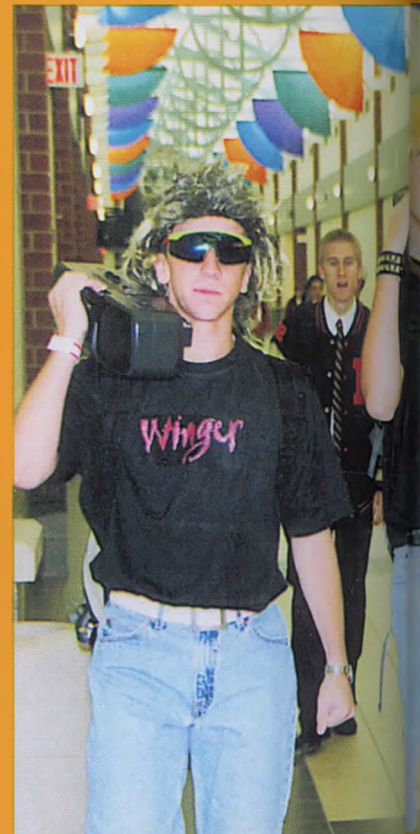
Wrapping up the week, the pep rally proved to be the

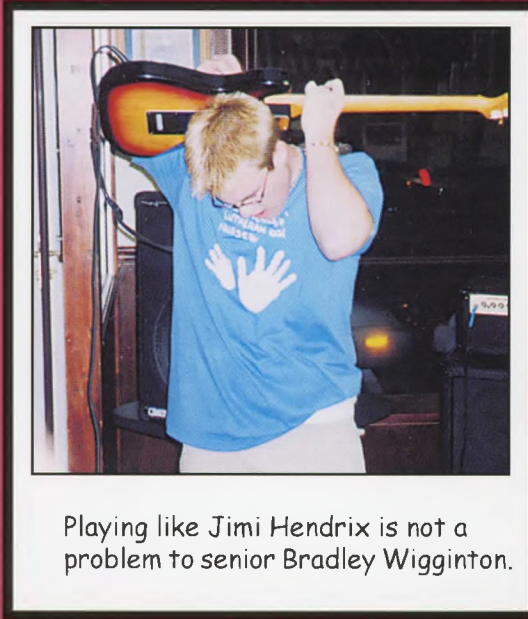


United We Jam

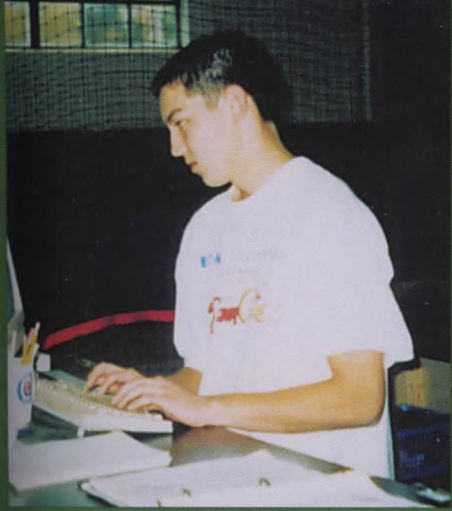

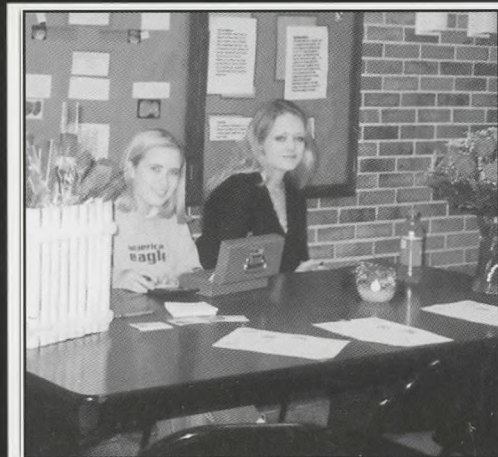

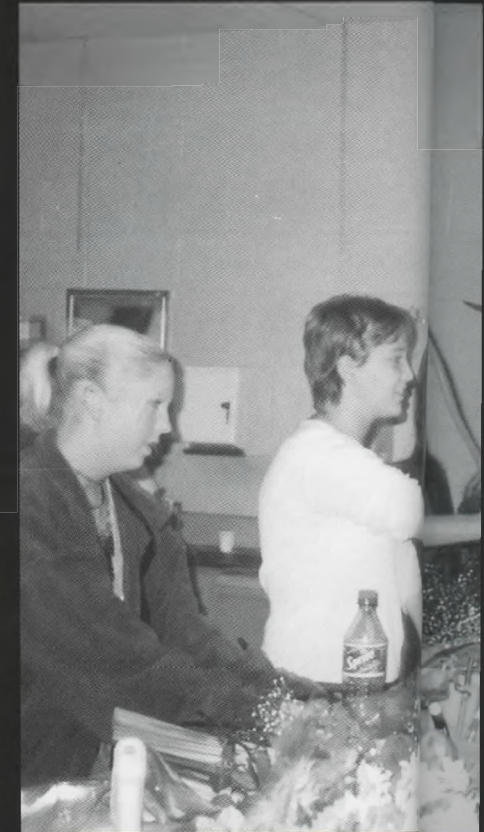

While communication between Northville and OTC-SW is sometimes difficult, the staff really go the extra mile to help the students find out what is going on.



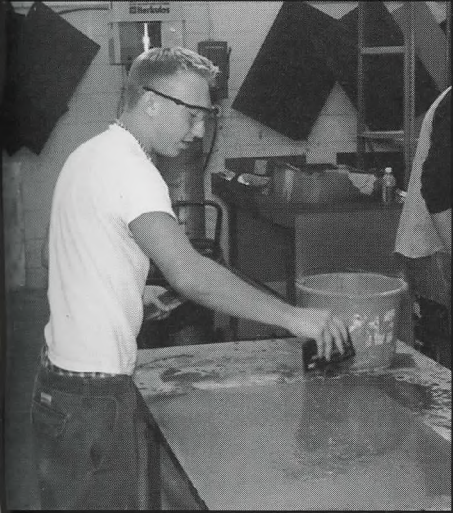

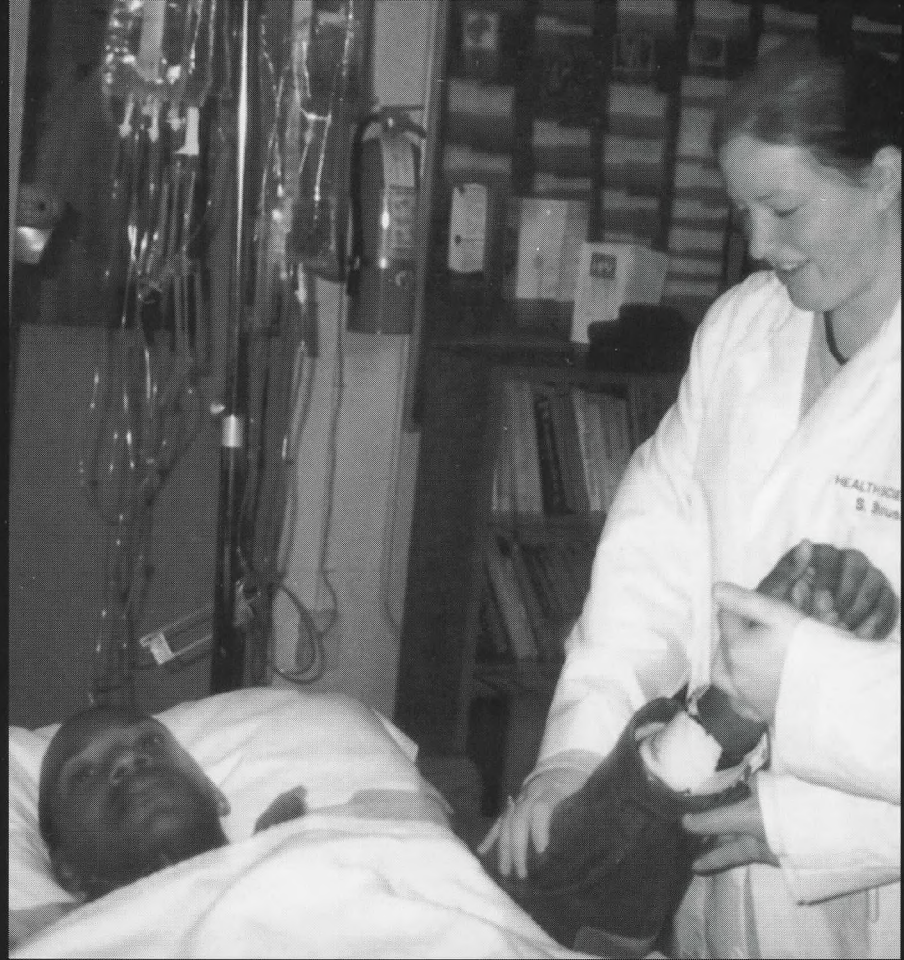

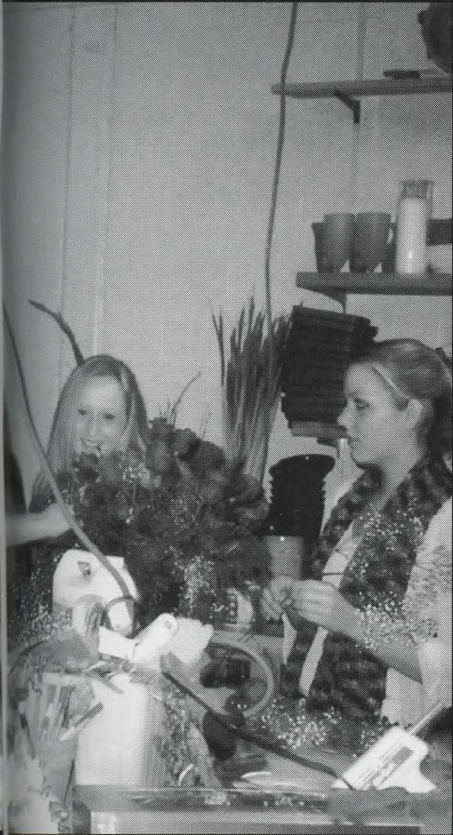

Spirit in the Spring

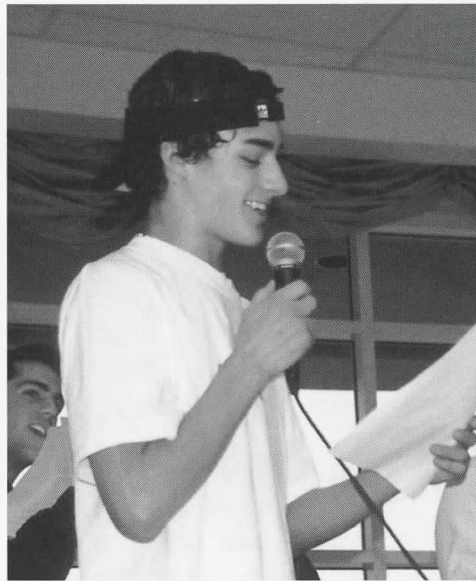

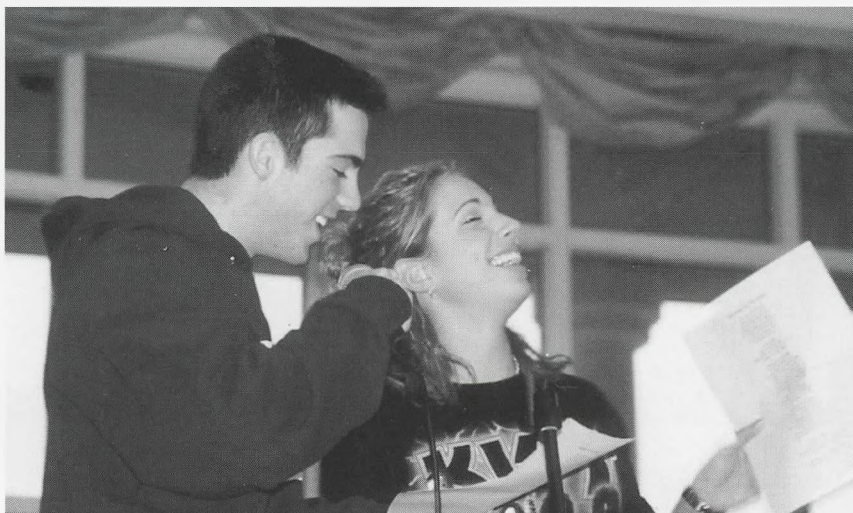

After the exciting Spirit Week and the previous night's basketball game, many students looked forward to the winter semi-formal on Saturday February 23.

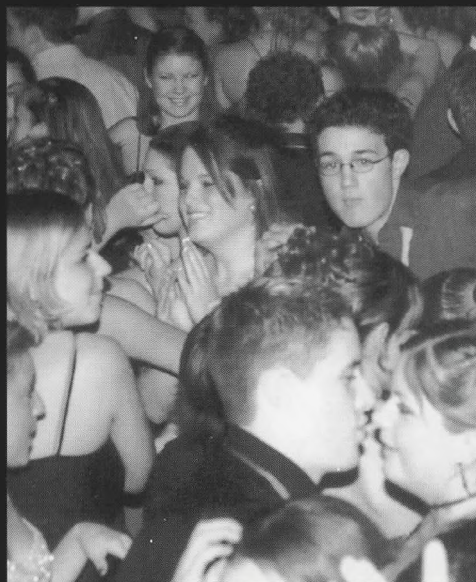

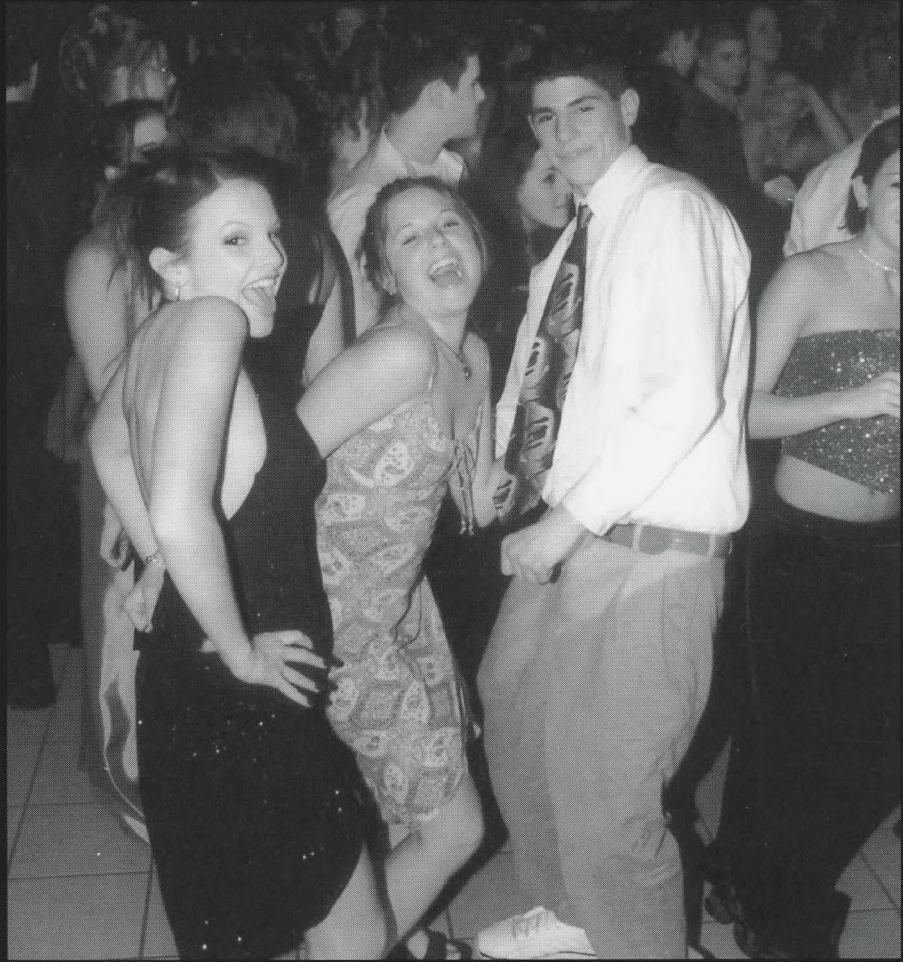

interesting to watch the increasing skill and competitiveness that makes this club new and exciting," exclaimed Trace Evans.

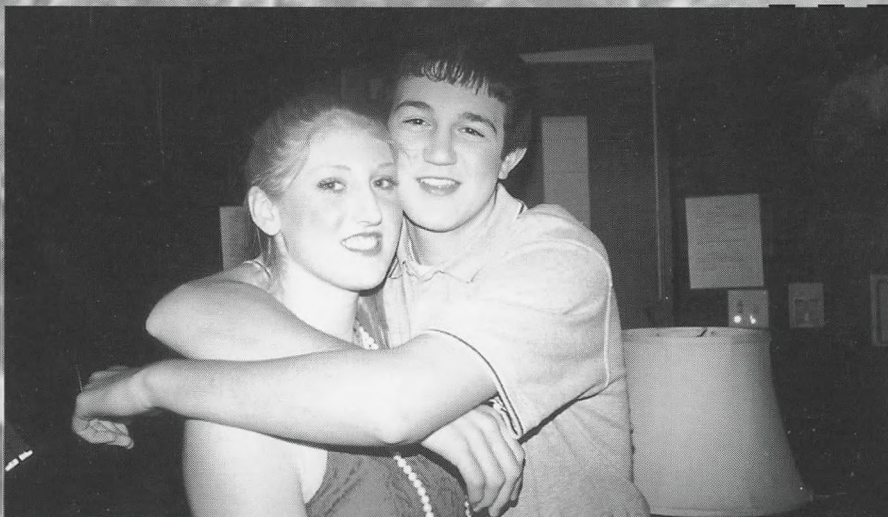
Overall, the new club additions and great turnout this year helped the organizations at NHS grow larger and better.

Student Congress

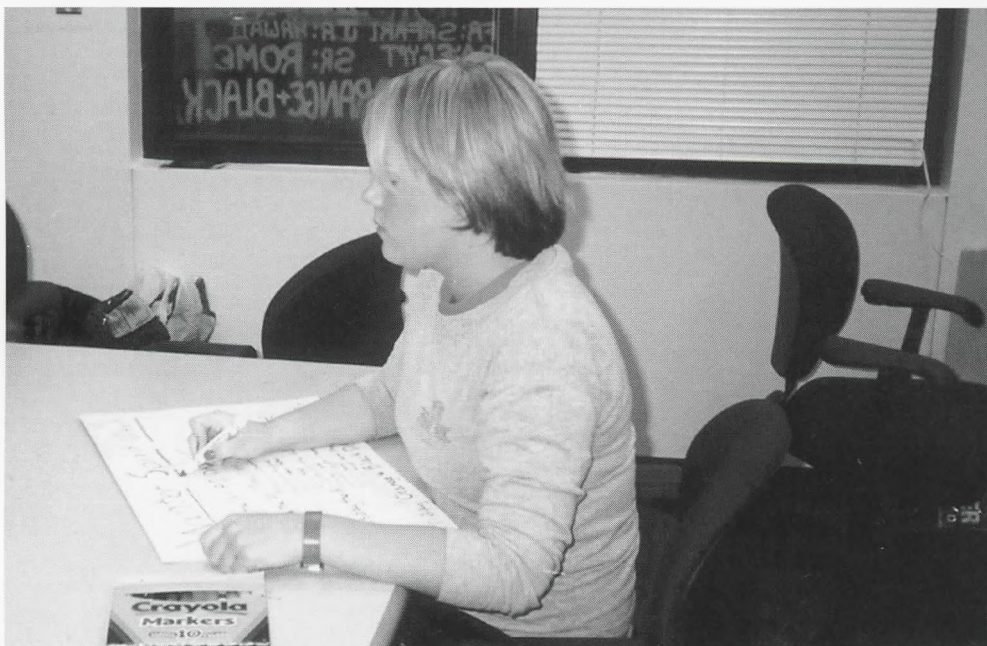

Our student congress did a great job of making signs and announcements to let the student body know what important events were coming up. All of their hard work really made our 2001-2002 school year a special one.

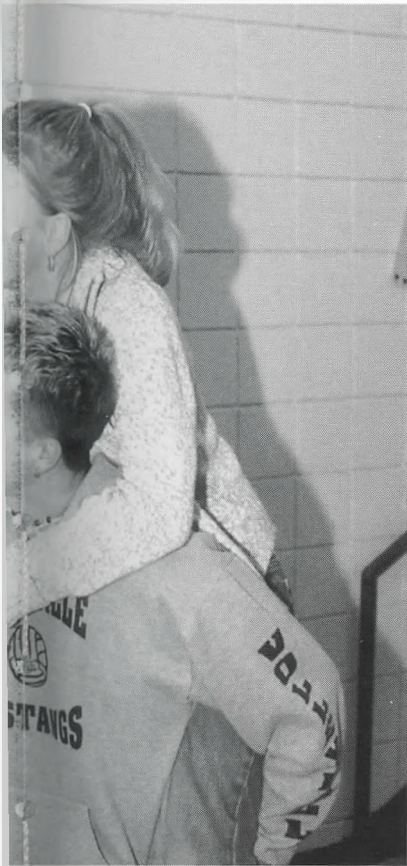

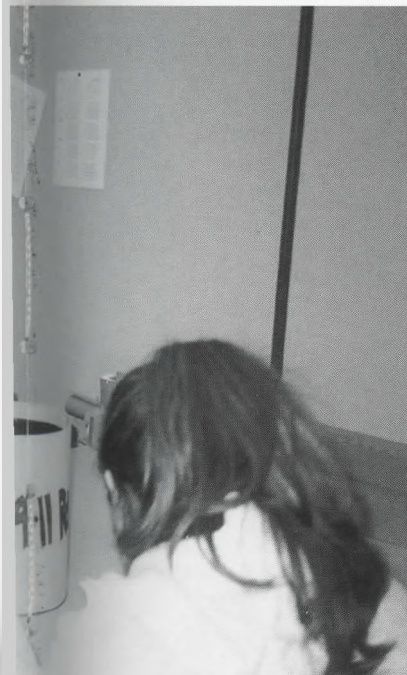

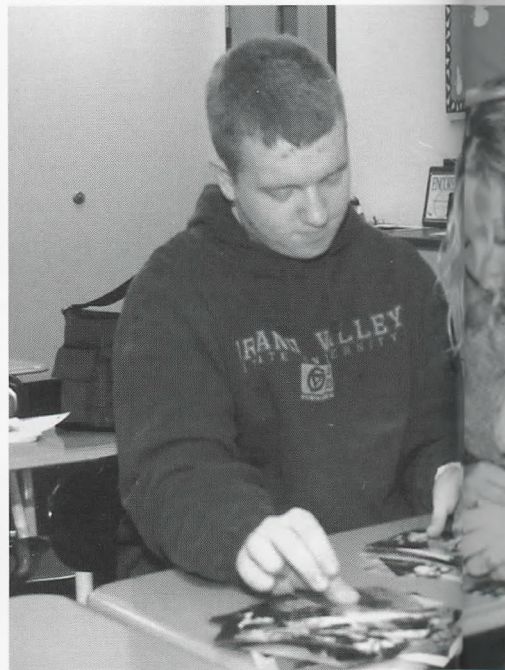
It may be surprising to the average student to see what goes on in Mrs. Hall and Ms. Jensen's fourth block-it's more than the eye can see.

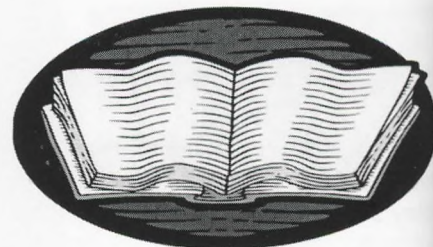

There is no doubt that these students' hard work paid off making, NHS a better and safer environment for everyone.

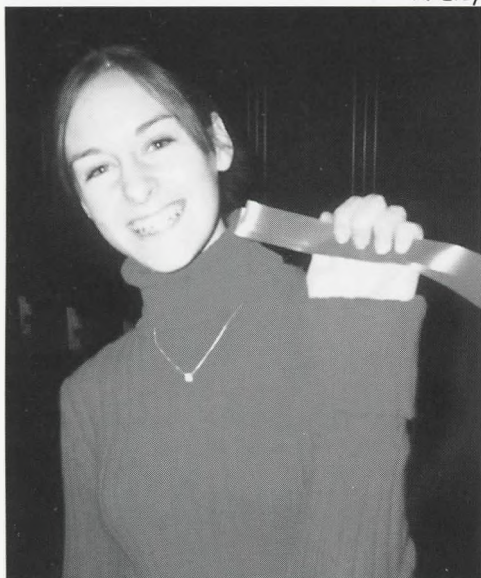

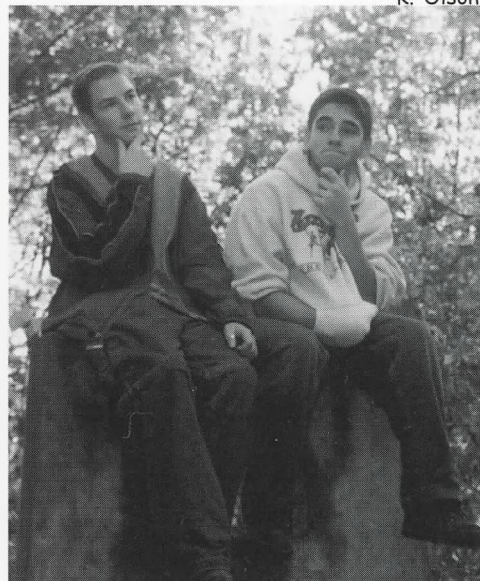

"Joining bowling was the best thing that has ever happened to me," was the enthusiastic response from Captain Katie Beger of the Northville Bowling Club.

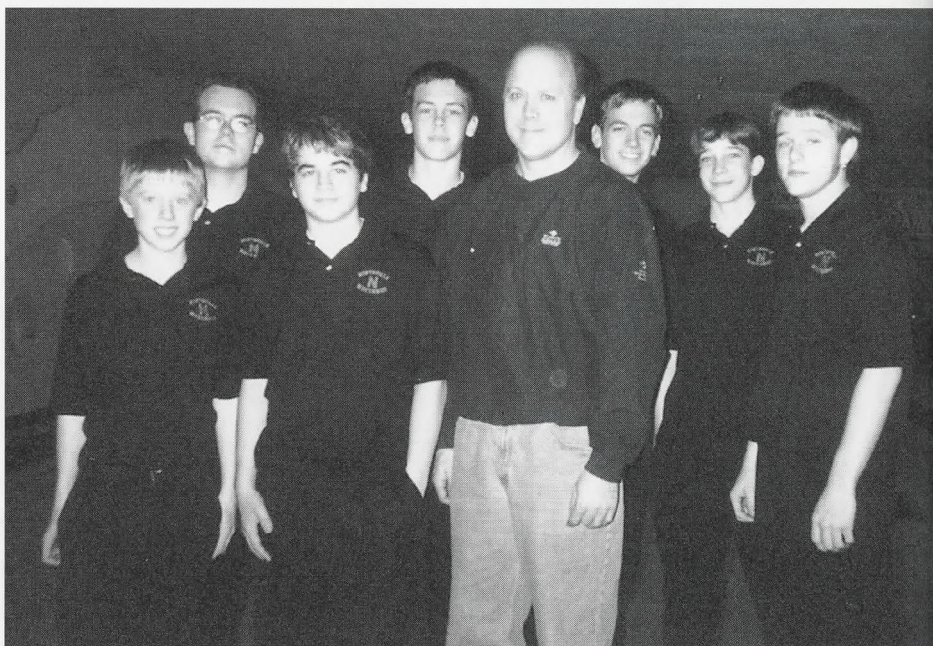

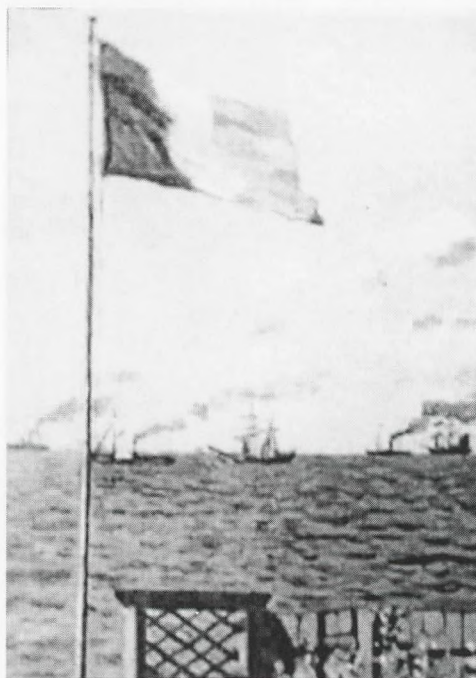

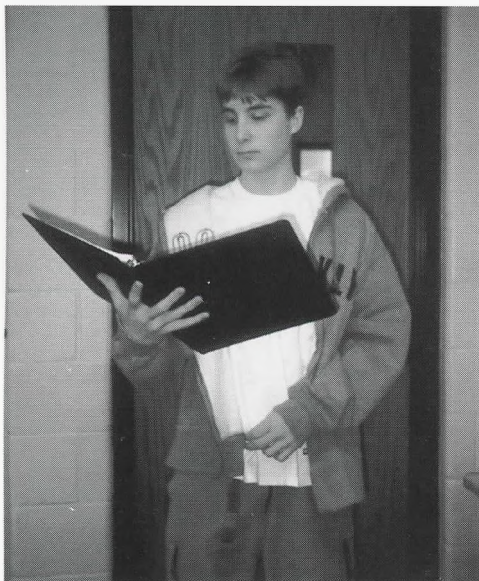

All the members enjoyed talking to the elementary schools and encouraging the kids to make wise choices.

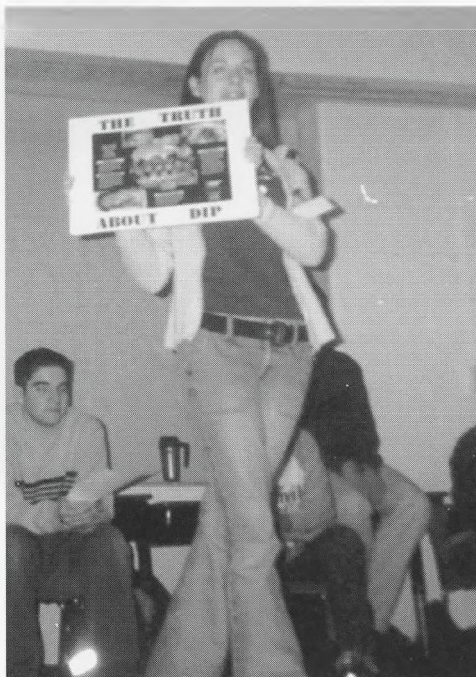

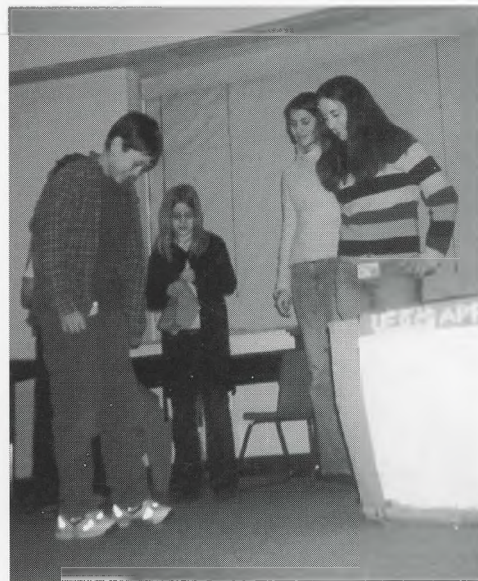

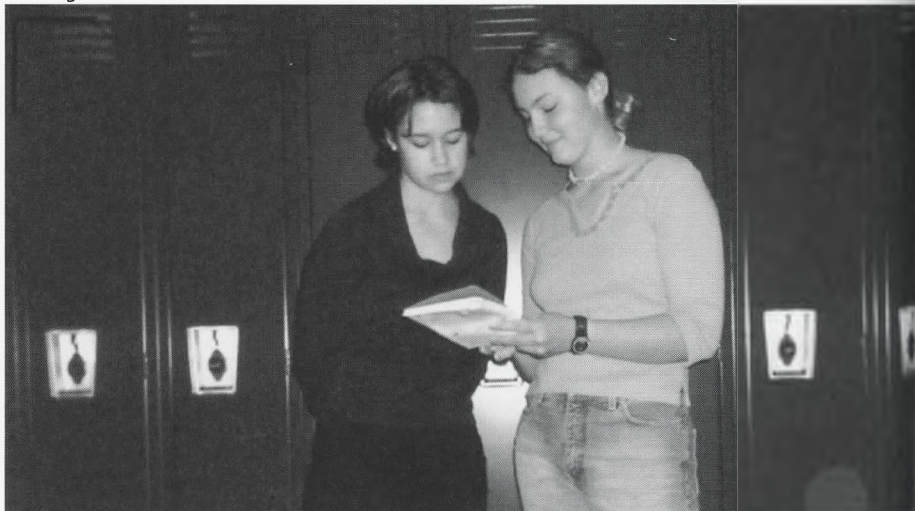
"I was glad to have someone help me around this school. If I didn't have an adopter, I would still be lost," said junior Kelly Rudolph when asked for her opinion of the program.

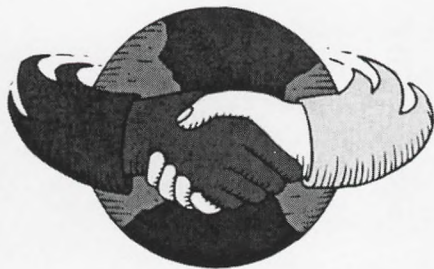

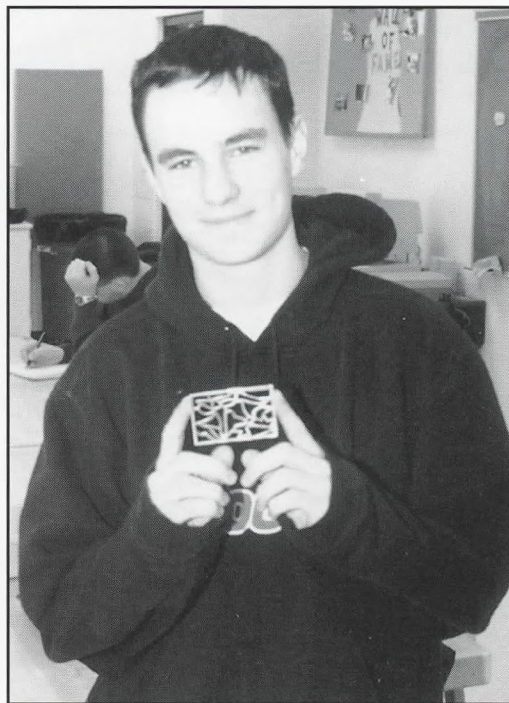

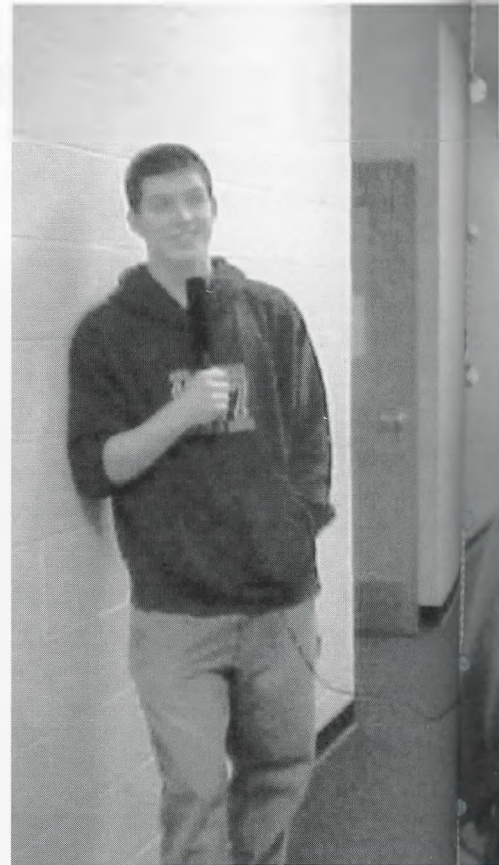

information and entertainment on a daily basis.

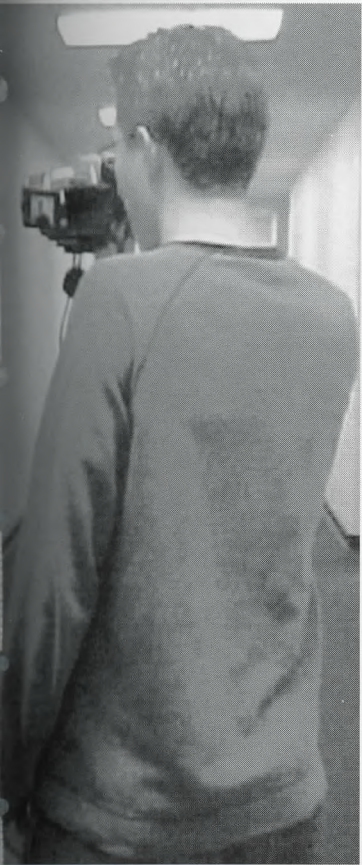

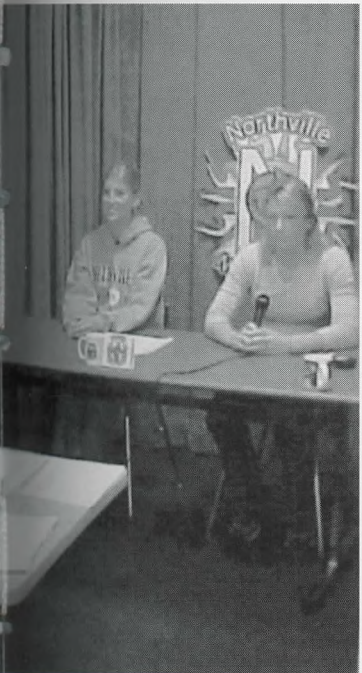

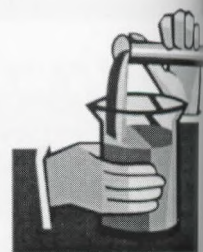

To be able to fund their team, they participated in fundraisers, such as spending a Saturday working at a University of Michigan basketball game.

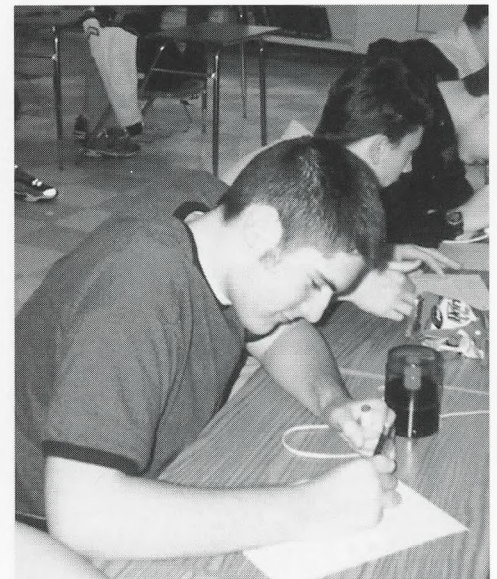
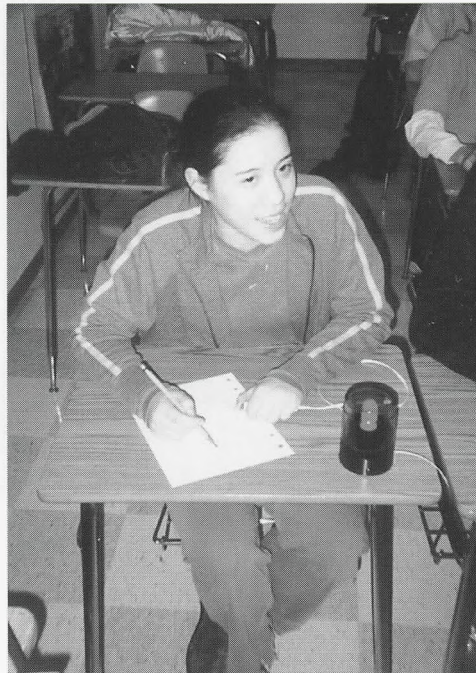

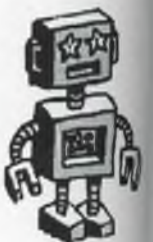

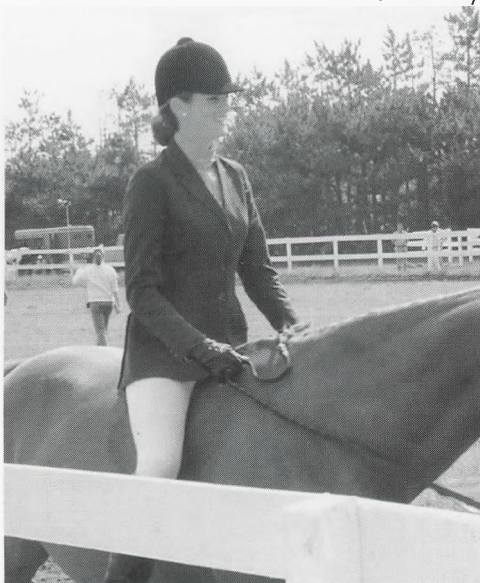
Back In The Saddle

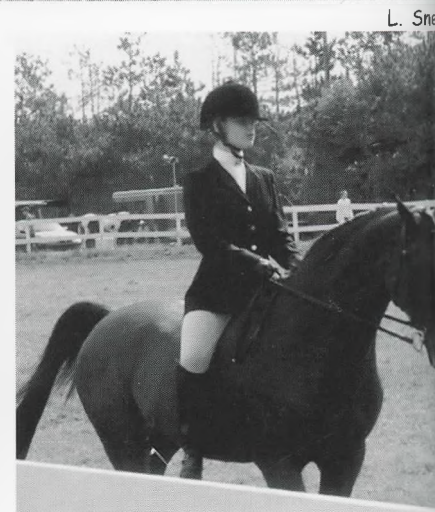

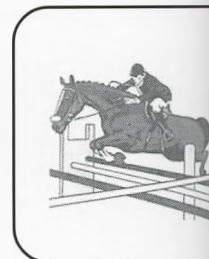

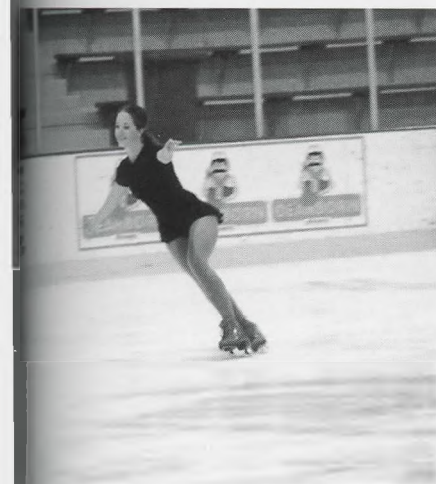

National Honor Society

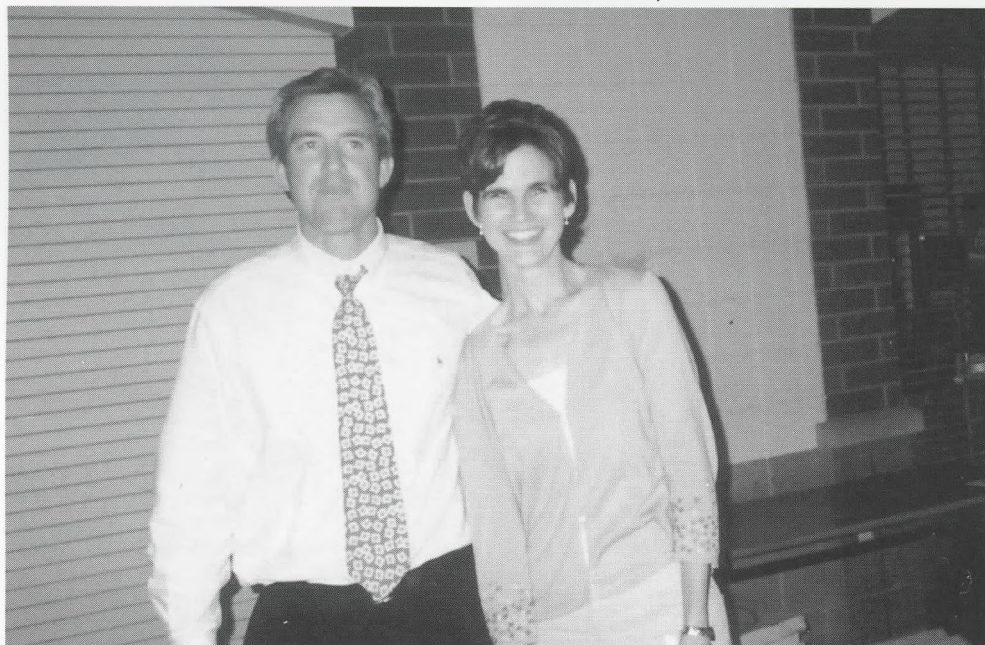
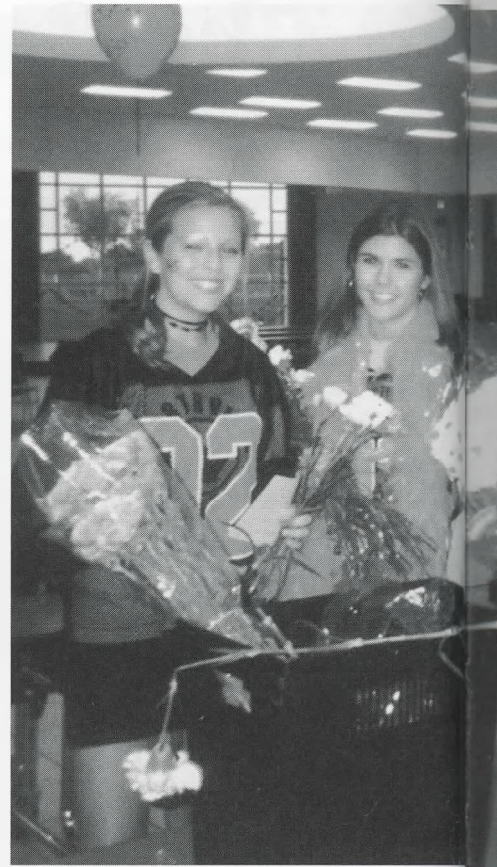

Leading the marching band out onto the football field are Drum Majors, Timothy Calkins, Kathryn Berger, Rachel Marcus and Susanna Klimek.

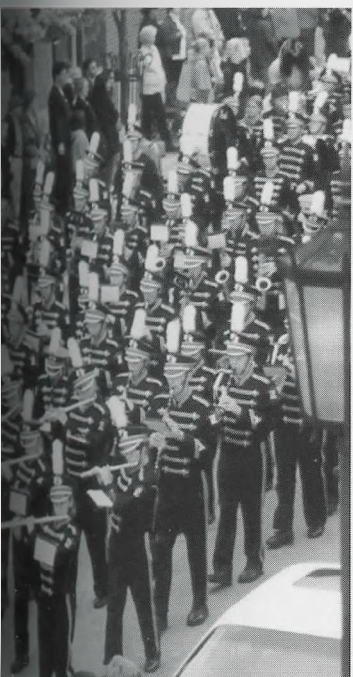
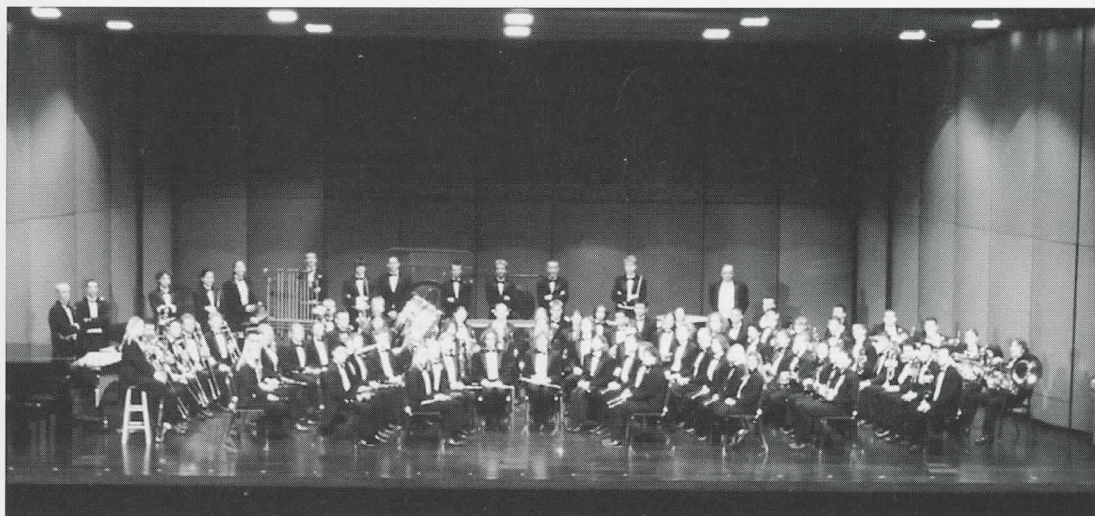

In February, Bel Canto was invited to St. Mary's college in South Bend, Indiana, where they participated in a festival.

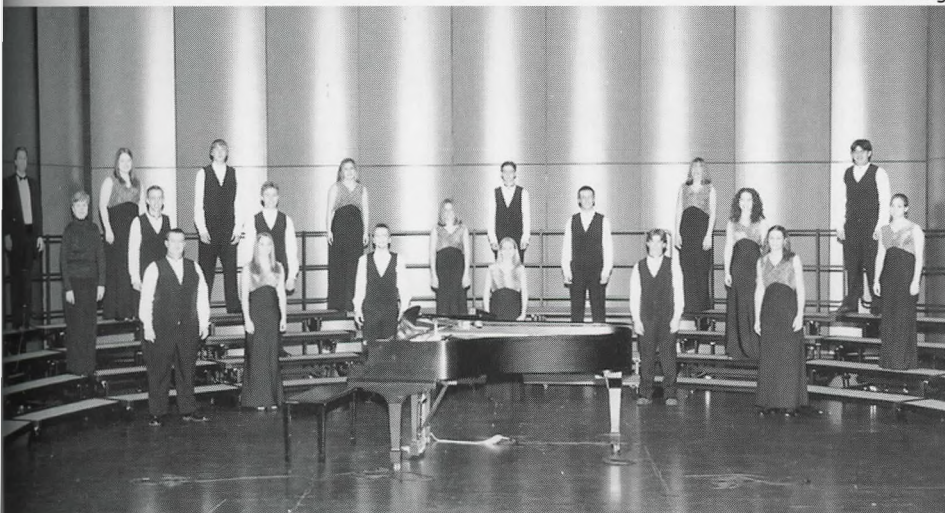
This past year, the choirs worked hard and were quite successful in everything that they participated in. No wonder the program was so large and only grew more with each year that passed.

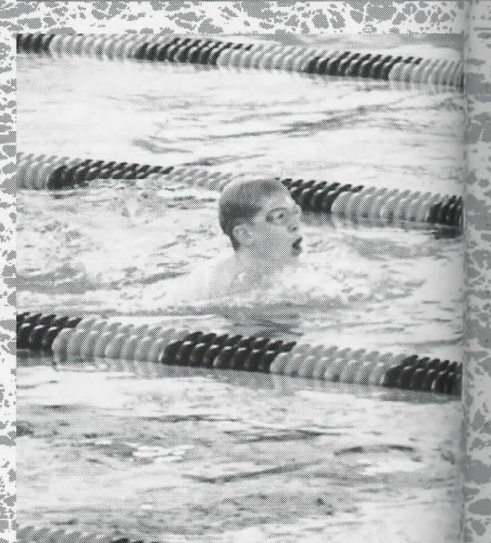

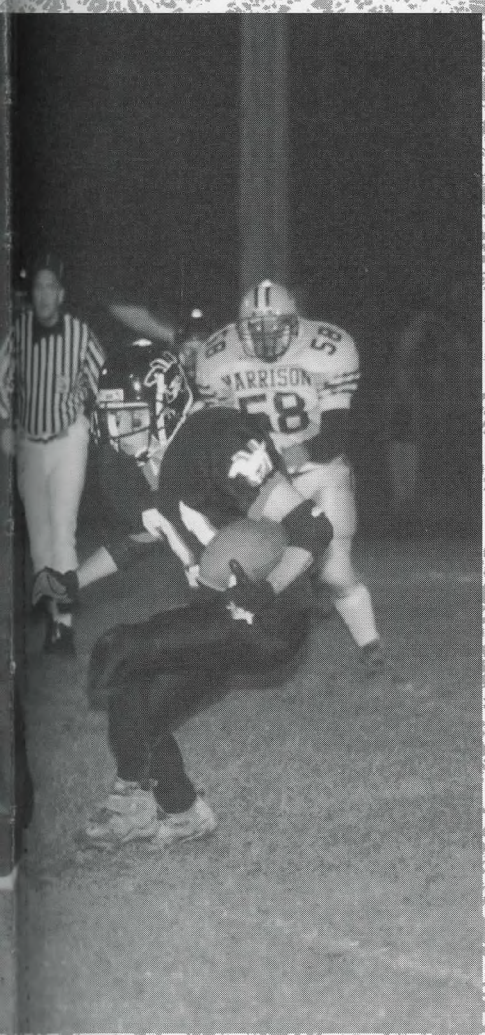

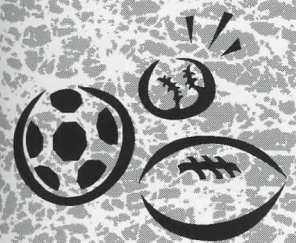

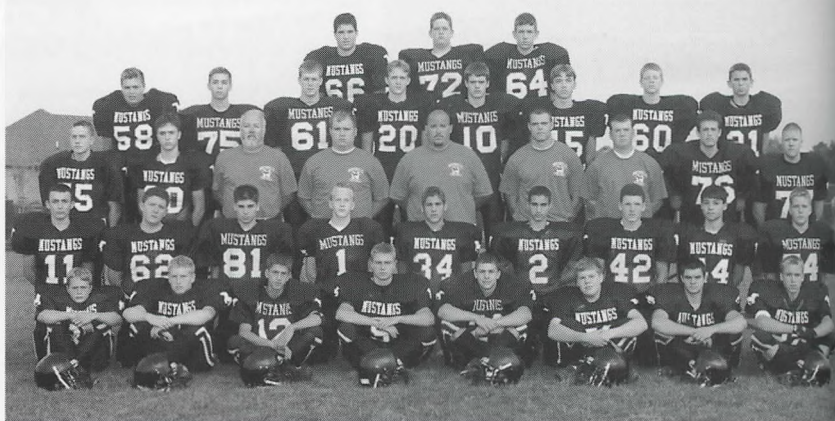
Goalline Stand

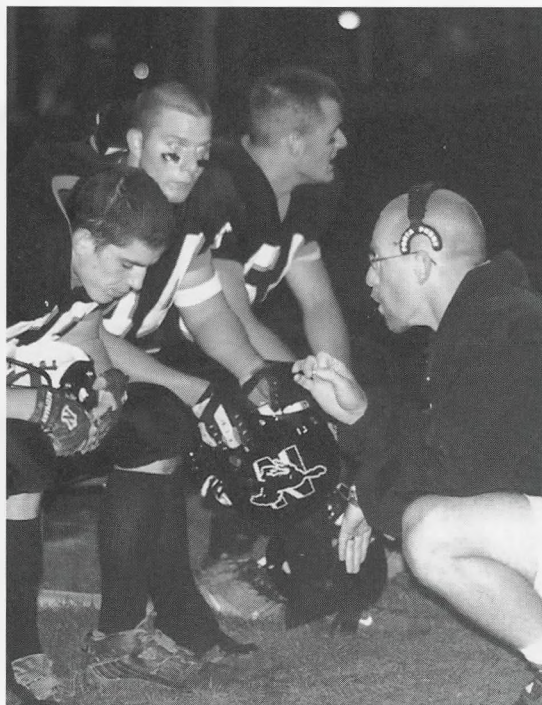

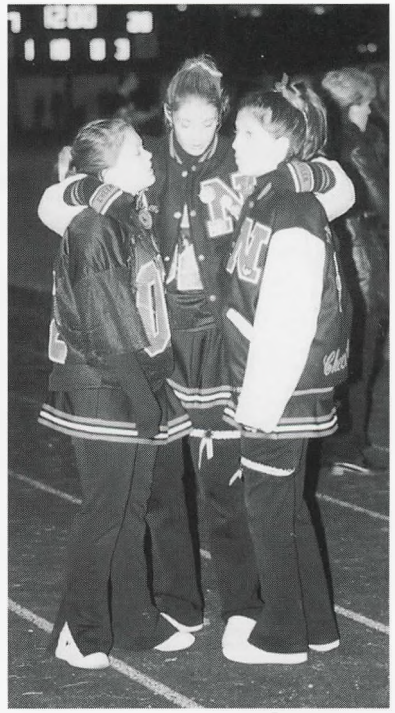

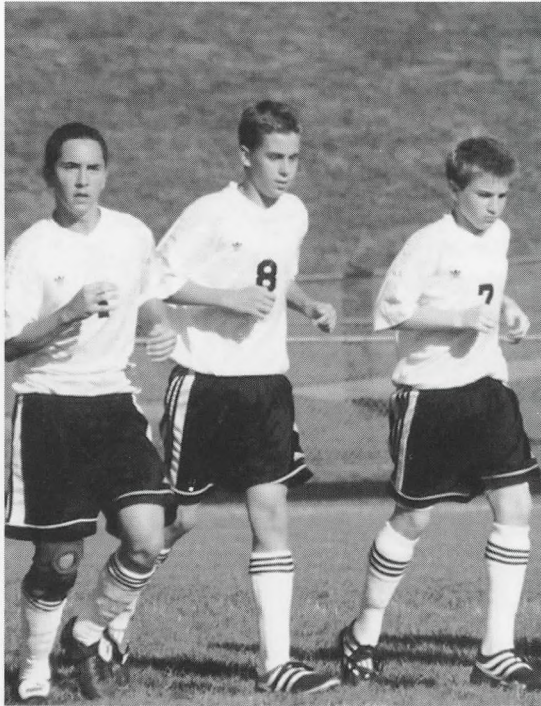

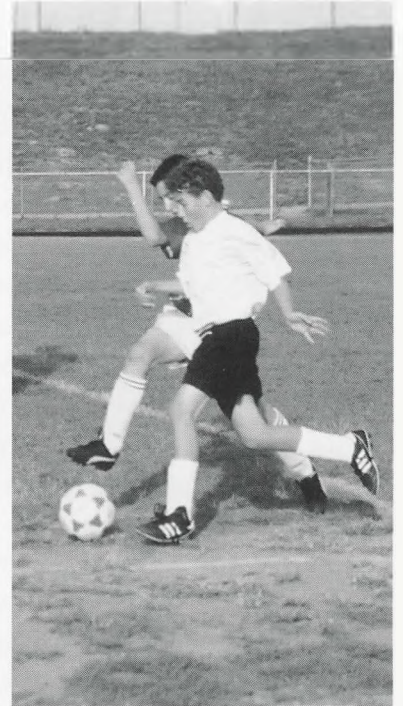

Northville Women's Basketball awed the crowds this year with their amazing athletic talents. The team came together as a unified group to perform their best, keeping the fans on the edges of their seats.

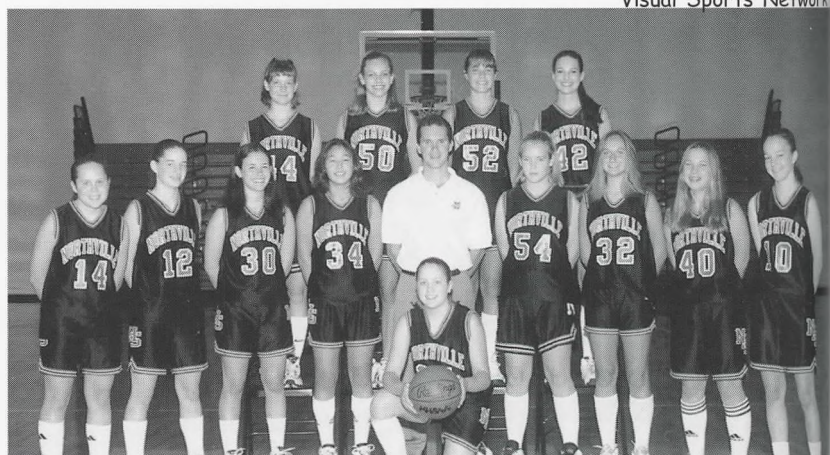

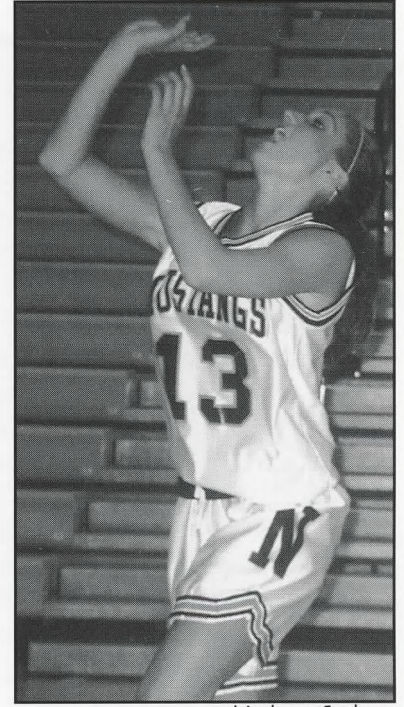

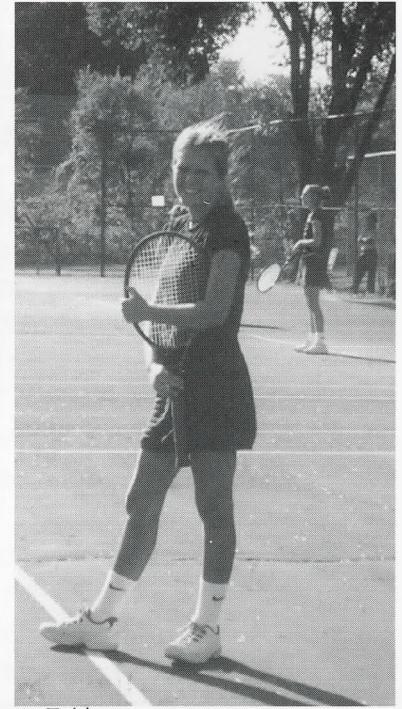

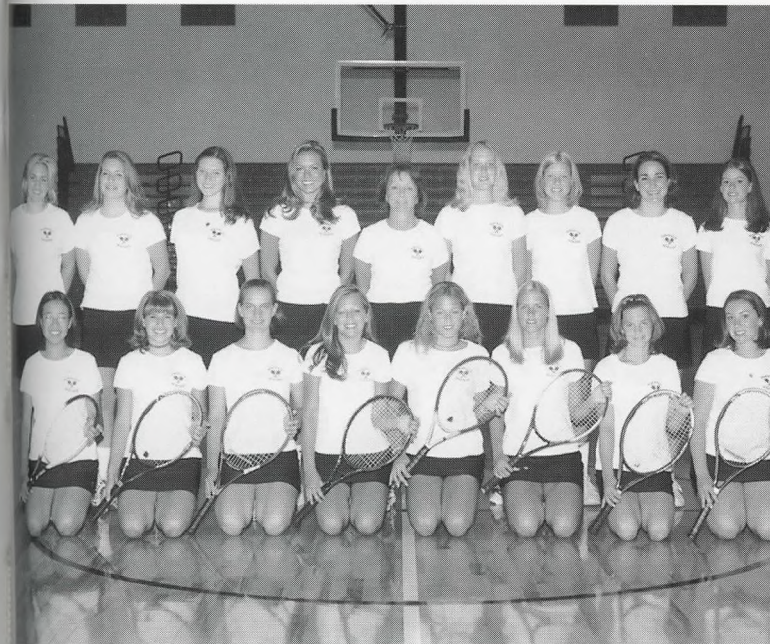

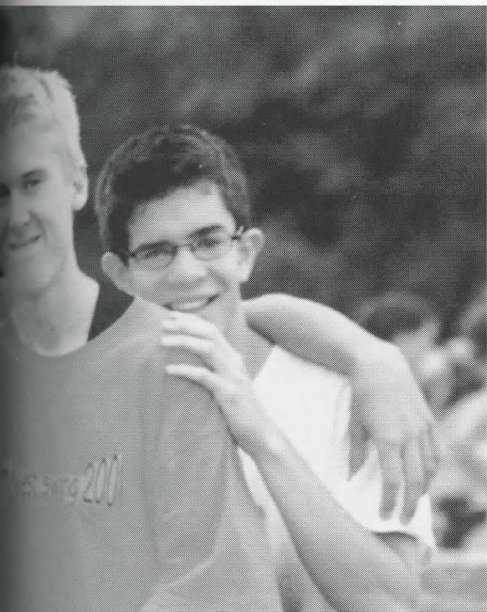

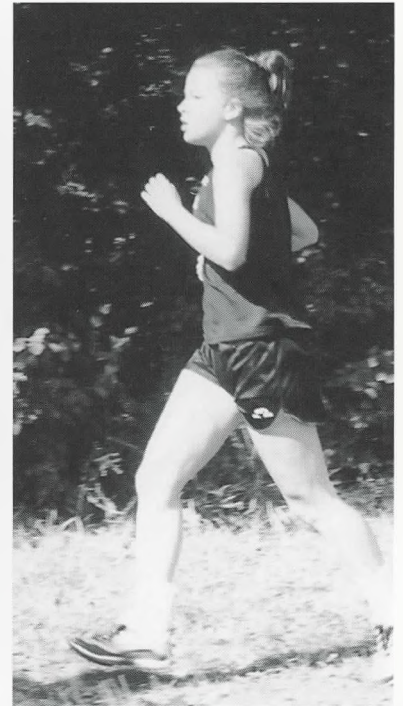

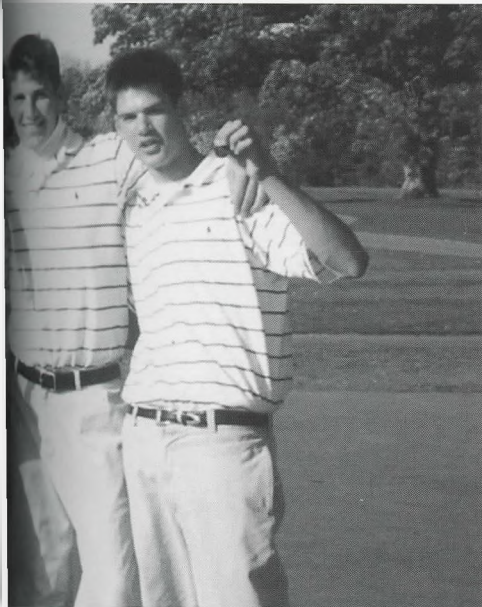

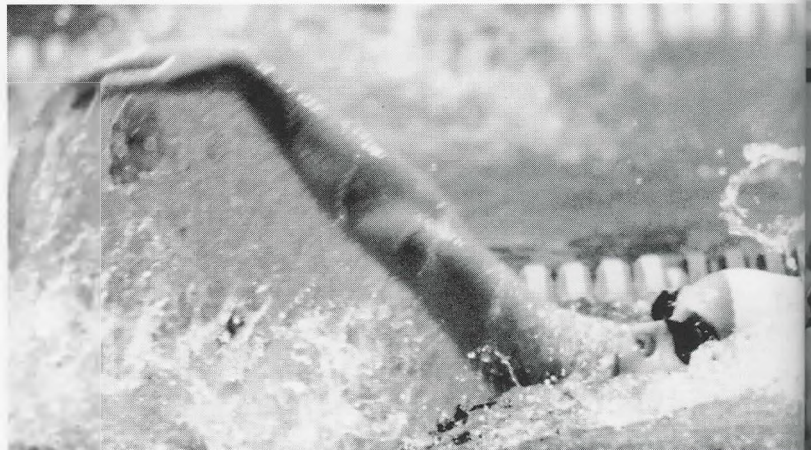

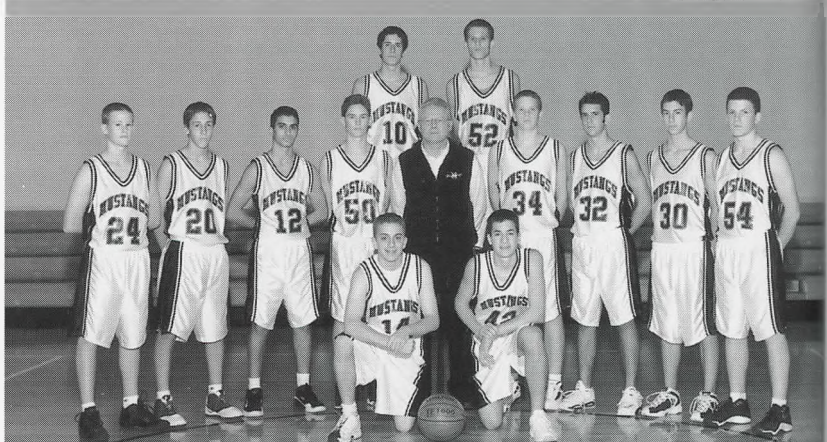

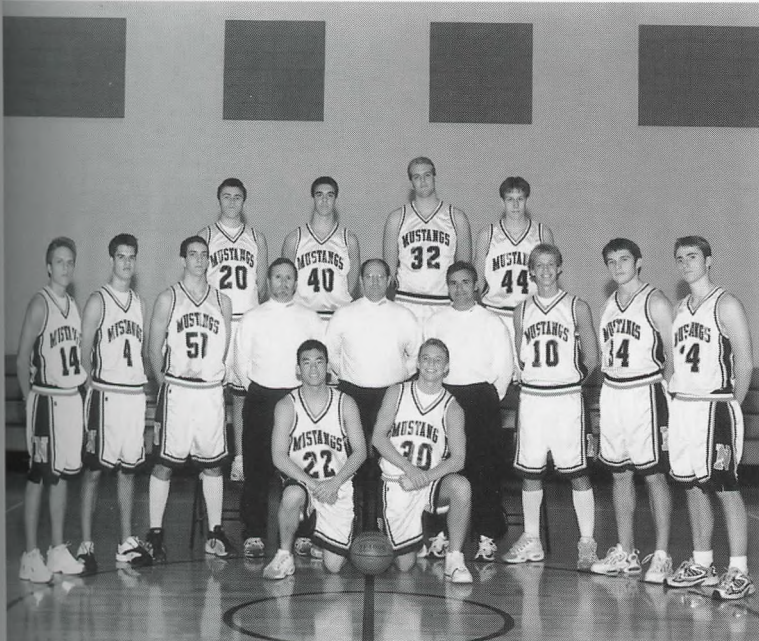

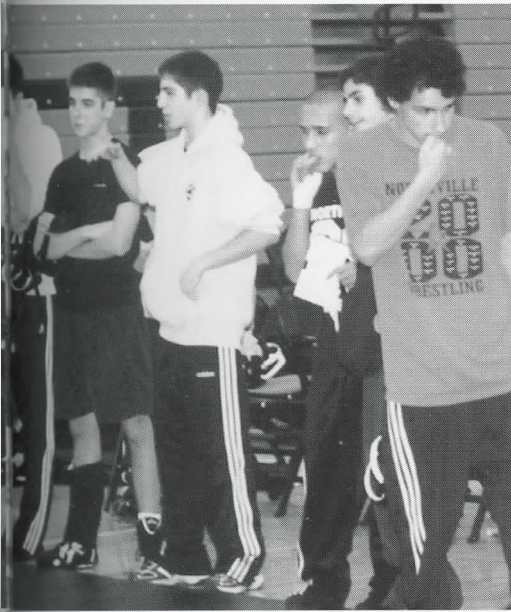

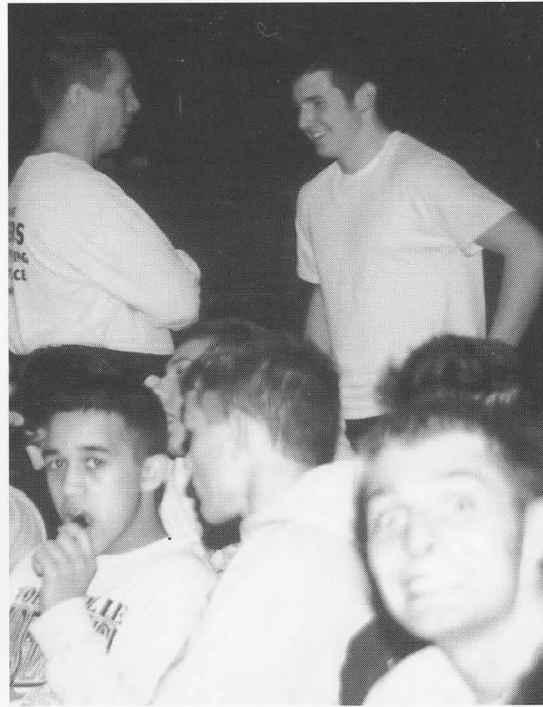

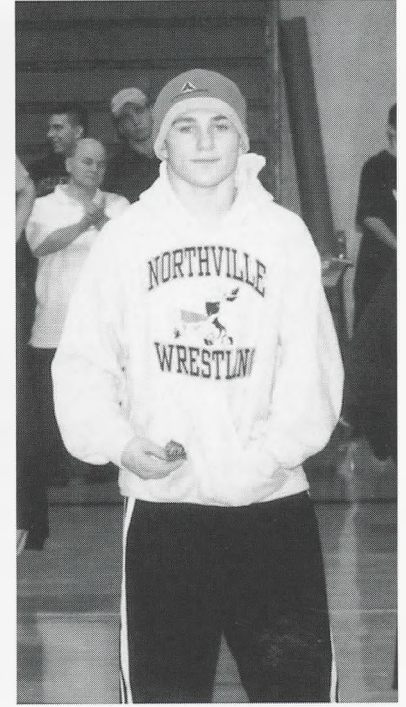

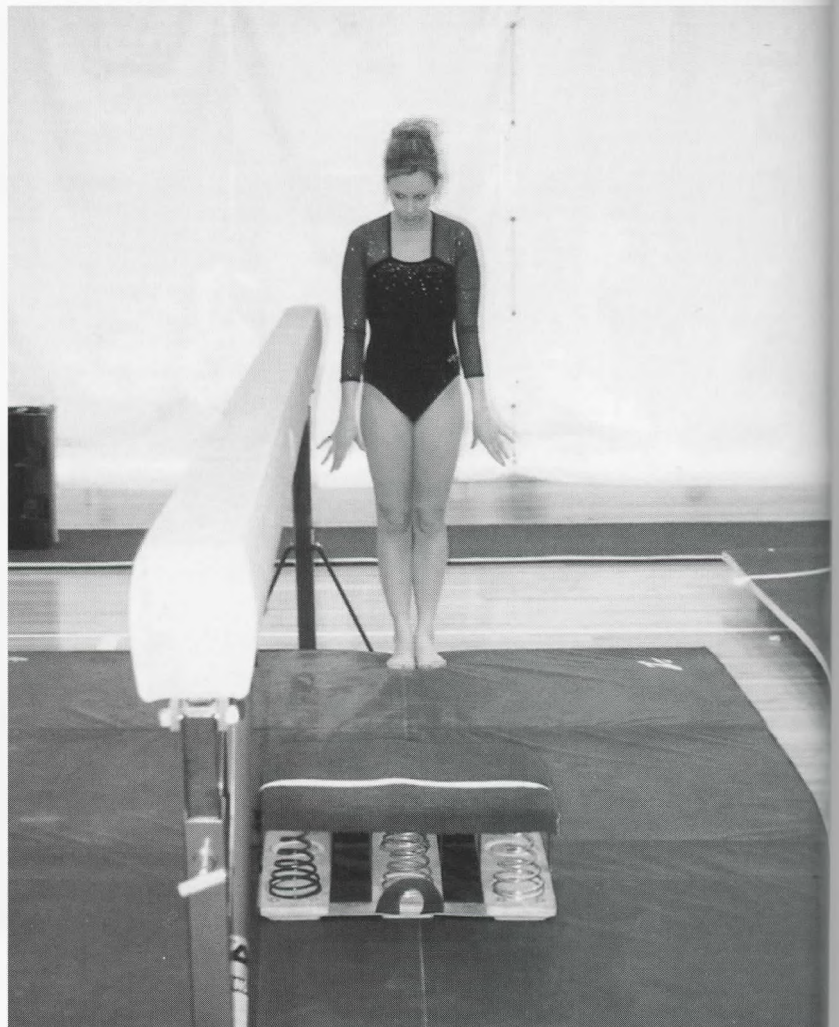

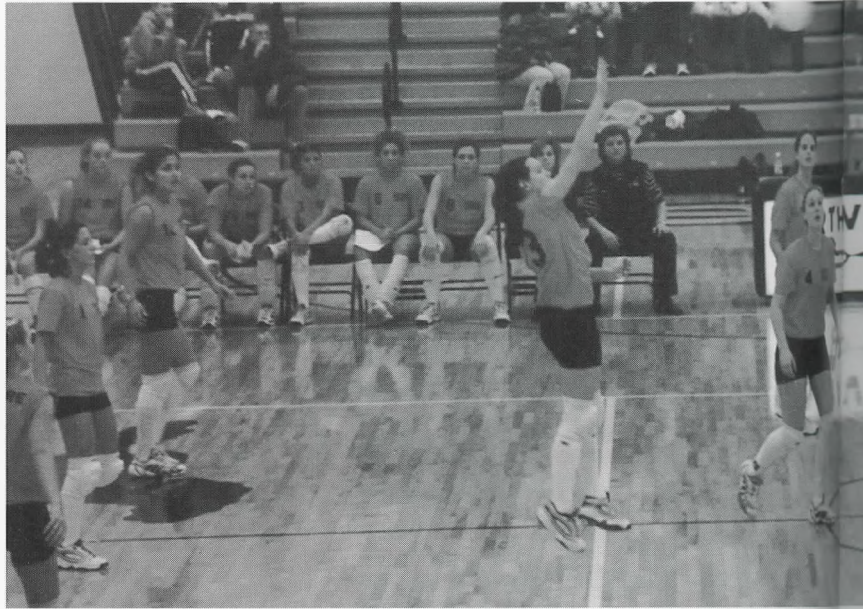
Serving Stars

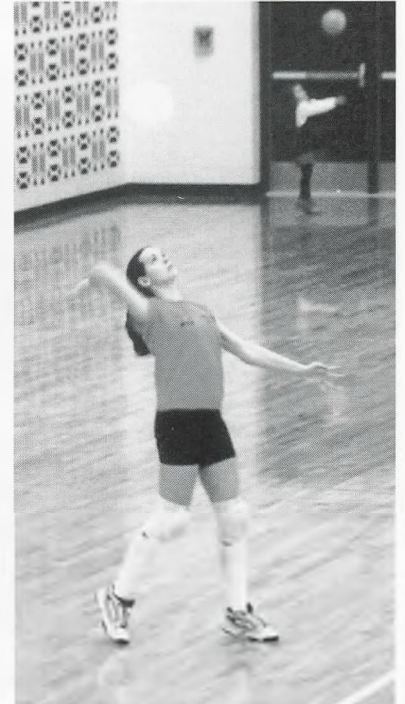

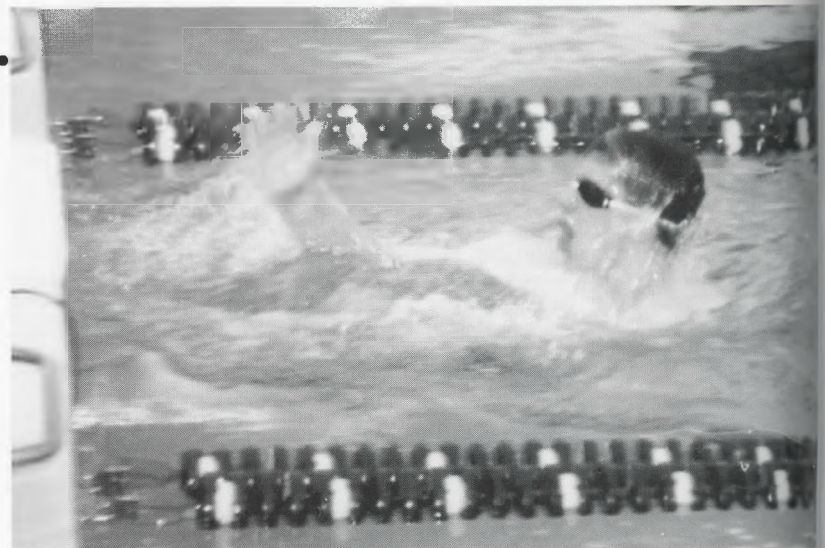
They had two practices a day. The first practice started at five thirty in the morning until seven o'clock in the morning. Their second practice was right after school until five o'clock p.m.

All of this team's hard work, confidence and motivation really helped them to achieve their goals throughout the season. For having only seventeen guys on the team, this year they really came out strong.

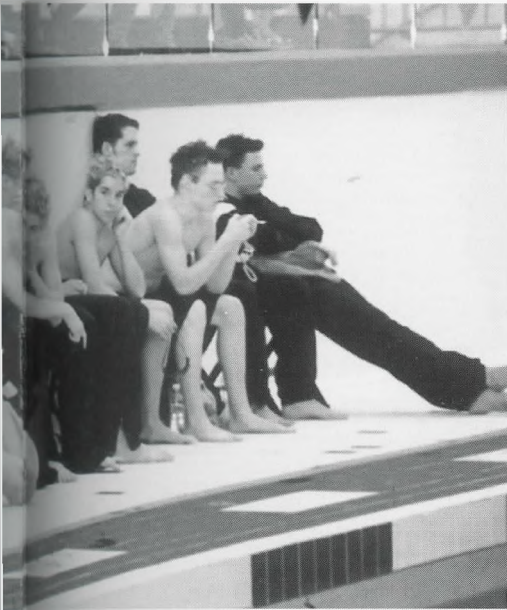

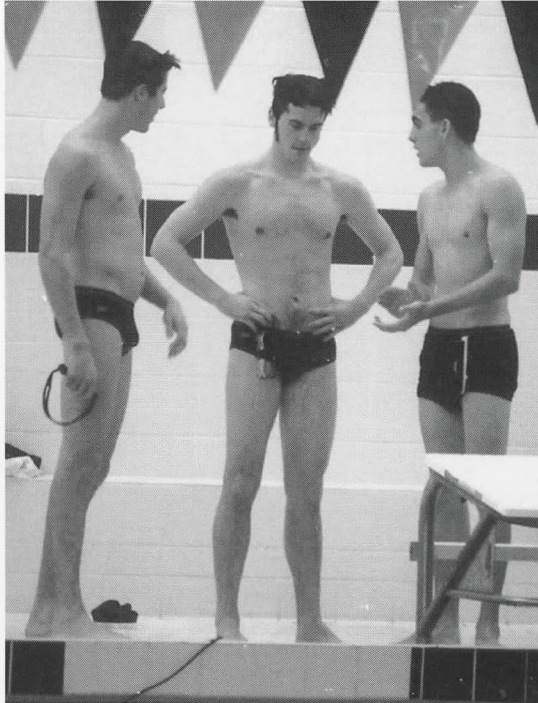

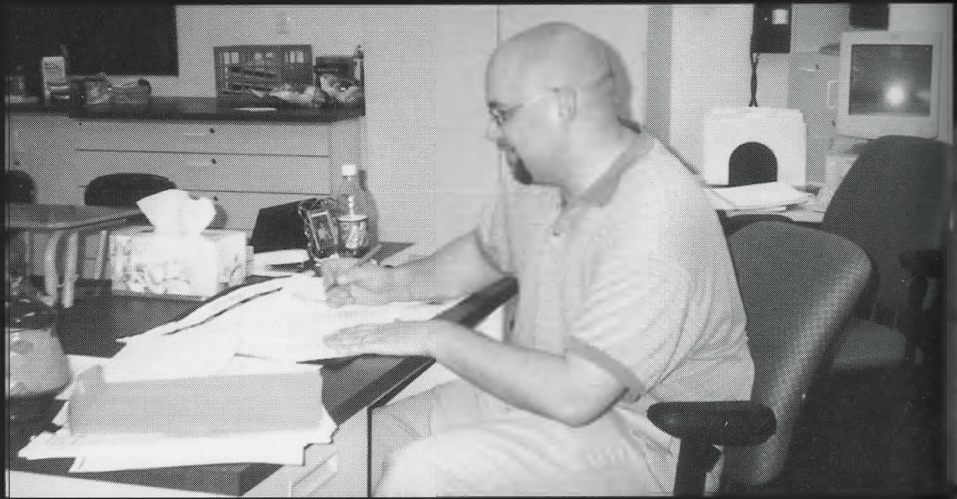
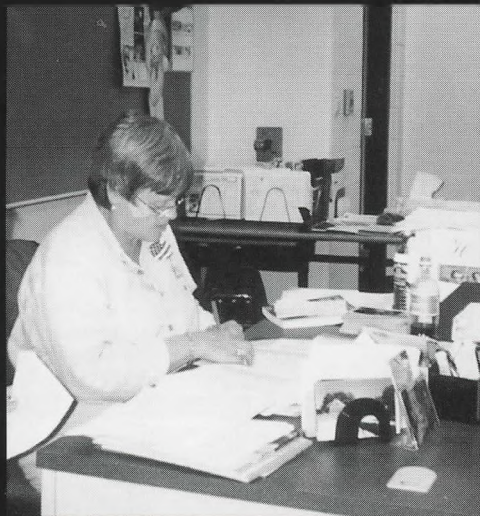


Uniting Thoughts

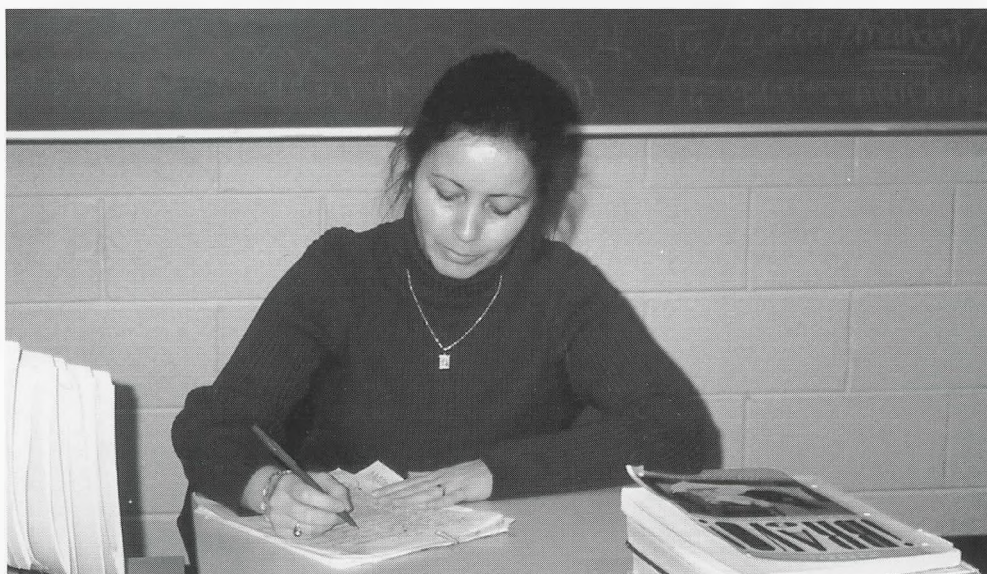
Uniting Cultures Through Languages

Researching New Ideas

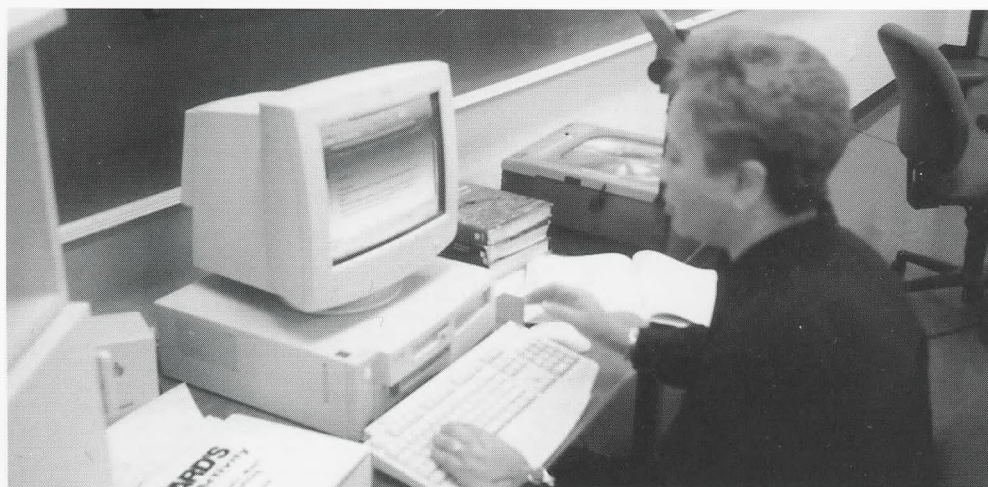

Mr. Meteyer also believed

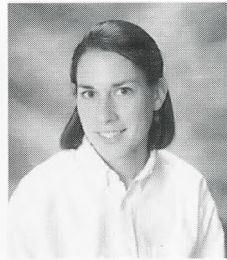
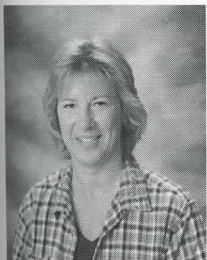

school year.

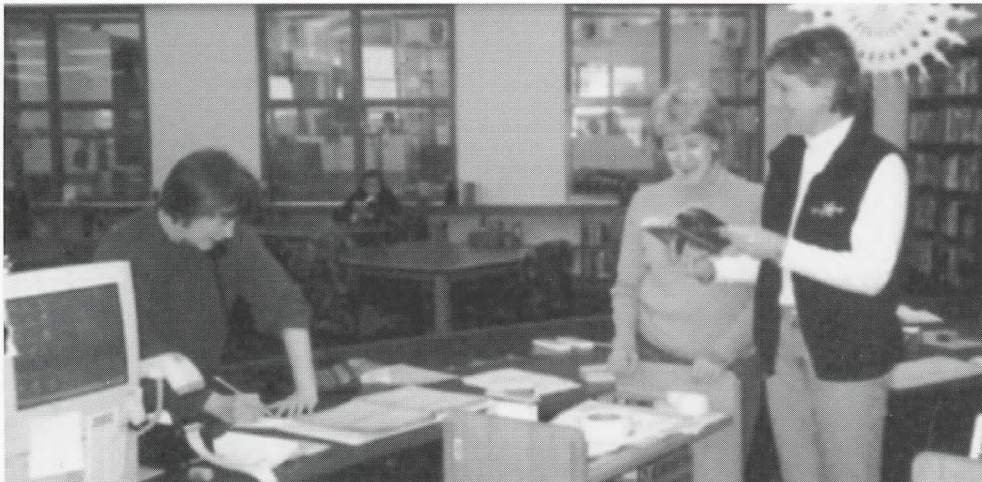

The freshmen quickly learned about the school spirit at Northville when they encountered their first Spirit Week. They stepped up to the challenge, as nearly every one was dressed up that week.

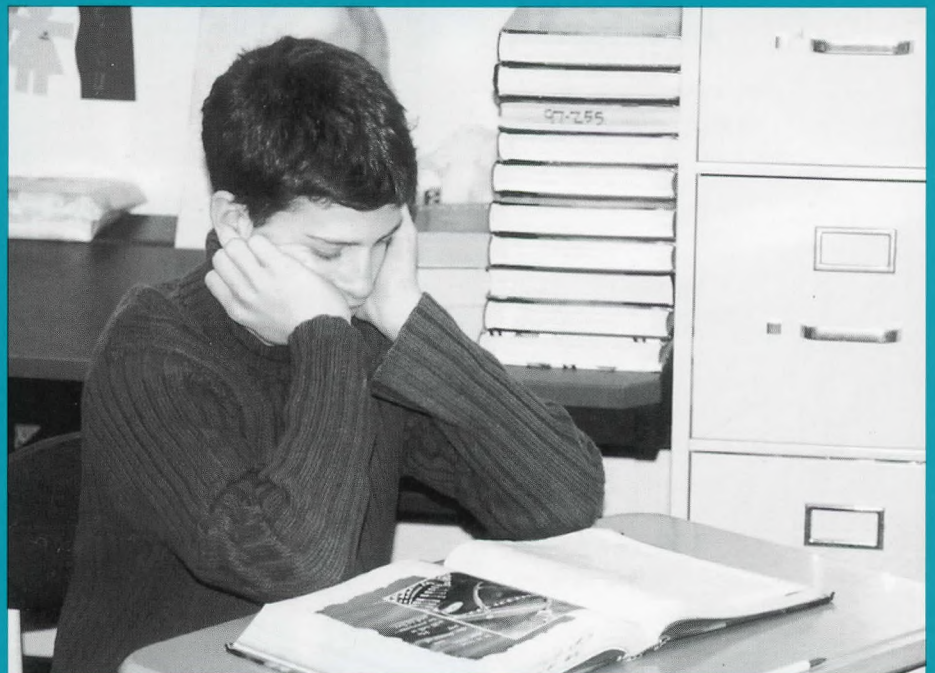

The 2002 Palladium was desktop published using six IBM Aptiva computers. The program used is Adobe Pagemaker 7.0. The 258 page book was printed on 100# Bordeaux, except the endsheet which was foil stamped in Illusion on Color Crimson(F19) front side only. The cover was printed as Vista Custom Embossed on Vibra Tex metallic brushed silver base material on 120 point Davies Binder Board . The cover also had a True Blue (#37) and Cadmium Red (#14) silkscreen application on front lid and spine. The binding is Smyth Sewn, rounded and backed.

The 2002 Palladium used Comic Sans as the primary typeface, printing the body copy in 12 pt., the captions in 10 pt., and the photo credits in 8 pt. Additional typefaces used in different sections included Kristen ITC, Times New Roman, Harrington, Tempus Sans ITC, Ravie, Curlz MT, Papyrus and Jokerman.

All underclassmen panels were from Jostens National School Studios. Pictures were taken digitally and directly sent to the Herff Jones Plant. Team pictures were from Visual Sports Network. All graphics and layouts were created by staff graphics experts. Candid photos were taken by both Prestige, students, faculty and staff. There were 47 pages of four-color process. Additional spot color added throughout the book include Emerald (HJ348), Violet (HJ266), Turquoise (HJ320), Gold (HJ 960), Silver (HJ970) and Navy (HJ281).

Subscription sales funded most of the publication cost. Circulation of the 2002 Palladium was 1500 books. The cost per book was \$40.00. Additional monies were the result of business advertising. Ads ranged from \$50.00 to \$200.00.

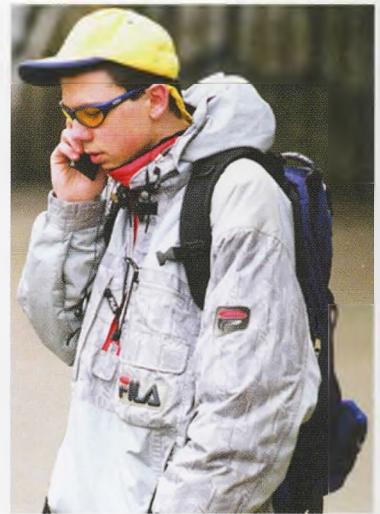

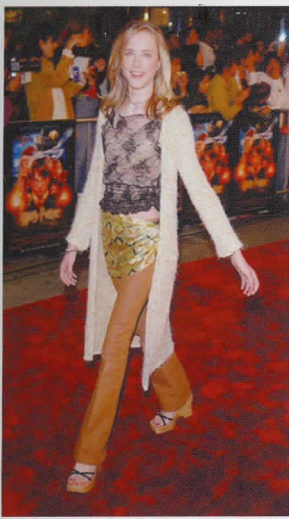

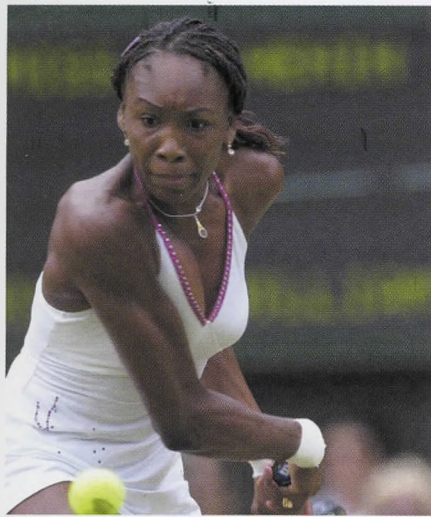

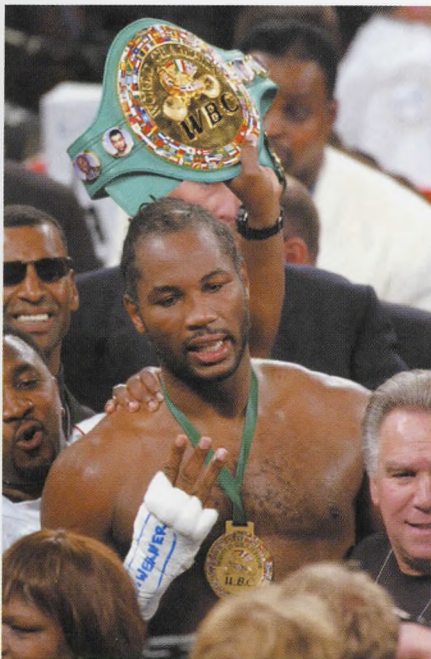

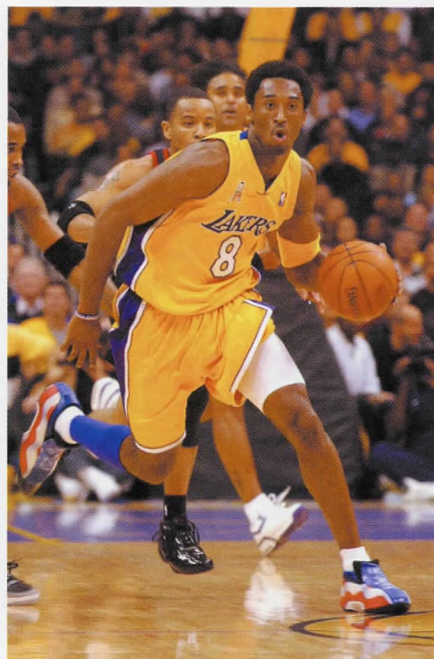

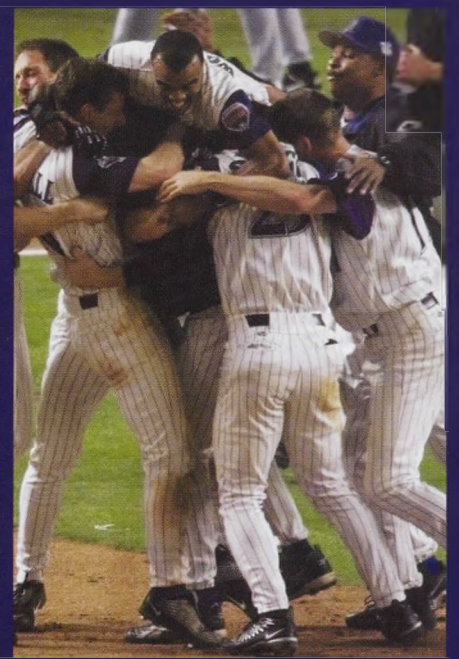

- PGA star David Duval took home his first career major title, the 2001 British Open, in July.

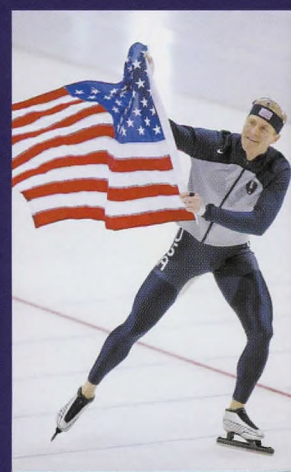
